We are enjoying discussing the daily images displayed and having a go at some of the suggested activities.

Topic

This half term our topic is... **Land Ahoy!**



Yo ho, yo ho, it's a sailor's life for me. Get your sea legs on, it's time to sail the salty seas. Navigate, investigate and explore the world, just like Captain Cook. Make a boat, sink a ship, fly a pirate flag. Speak like a pirate, write like a poet, then weigh and measure a pirate's booty. How do rescues happen at sea? Find out about brave volunteers and young Miss Darling, rowing her boat across stormy seas. Sing a sea shanty whilst cleaning the poop deck, then search the school grounds for Captain Longbeard's hidden treasure. There's land ahead. Let's get this ship to port.

I would like us to start our new topic with a mini project on **BOATS.**

Throughout this project the Children will strengthen science, maths, creative-thinking, and problem solving skills as they explore boat making!



1. Research and create an informative POSTER based on boats.
2. Draw and label a picture of a boat.
3. Design and make a boat.
4. Floating and Sinking experiments- Ask children to take their completed boats to the sink or bath. Explain that some boats may float and others may not and that if their boat doesn't float, they can make another one. Ask children to observe which boats float and which ones sink. What do they notice about the boats? Are the boats that float made of similar materials or are they similar sizes? Does the size of the boat seem to matter?
