

You can always think about if you can or can't recycle or reuse it before you throw it away.




Most Mondays, Sophie sends a PowerPoint about the topic. This week she changed it to a poster about the saving the ocean showing her learning from World Ocean Day.

Ella and Henry wanted to work together to make an ocean scene out of play dough.


So, when you read the topic tasks, have a think about how you would like to do it and present it: writing, drawing, typing, using computer skills, designing, making or using art.
