If you started the Tremors project work on rocks, next week builds on that with volcanoes. Now this is a week that I would really enjoy doing with you in class as it involves an orange, an explosive experiment and 3D papier mache volcanoes. Why an orange I hear you ask? It's a good way to show plate tectonics. When you peel an orange, it doesn't always come off in one go. The little bits are like the plates (earth's crust) which are slowly moving on the mantle. Some plates push together creating mountains, some slide over the top of another and sometimes there is a split in the crust. I will leave you to find out more about how volcanoes are formed.

I would love to know how you get on, especially with the volcano explosions and models. You can still email and attach photos or your parents can log on to Tapestry and upload images. This is a shared platform which means you can see what other children in Class 2 are doing and see work from Bilsdale, Class 1 and nursery. I have also uploaded the volcanoes topic board to Tapestry.

I found this during the week: a way to show how different rocks are formed using Starburst sweets. Please watch but do not try this at home as sugar gets very hot when it melts.
