Remote Learning 2020/21 Action Plan

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the COVID-19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted school year, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or even the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, we will do all we can to support them and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, for disadvantaged children, remote devices (e.g. laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

You will find here an overview of lessons to be completed each day. If you click on your class (on our website) you will see specifically the curriculum expectations set by your class teacher.

It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

Any response should be made within 48 hours. Where a pupil is self-isolating on medical grounds for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by the headteacher or SENDCO on a weekly basis and support offered as necessary.

Keeping devices secure

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time. Operating systems must be up to date – always install the latest updates.
