We hope everyone will stay safe this summer.

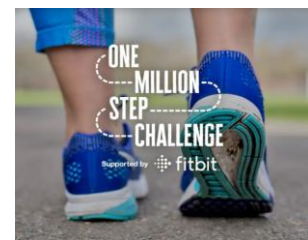
