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Dear Parents and Carers

Last week we said "Goodbye" to Mrs Tilley who has been working in our schools for 3 years. We presented a gift and marked Mrs Tilley's retirement with a socially distanced tea after school.

We have welcomed two new members of support staff into our schools recently, Mrs Battle has spent time in Class 1 and is now in Class 2 at Carlton and Mr Wallace has worked in both schools.

The National Tutoring Programme continues to be delivered by Mr Sellers and Mr Leivers.

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## Class 3

Class 3 are currently being Beast Creators applying all the skills they have learnt so far and creating a new insect. We started the topic identifying minibeasts on the school field taking photos of them which the children used to draw detailed diagrams as Darwin did. Using information about habitats, the children designed and made bug hotels handling tools safely to saw and glue wood. They are rightly proud of the finished articles. The children particularly enjoyed learning about deadly minibeasts and have incorporated features into their own designs.

## “Archie Project”

Class 3 are undertaking the Diocese of York Youth Challenge – the Archie Project – improving their leadership skills and considering what changes they can make to the community. As we have children in school with diabetes, we have chosen to support Diabetes UK and join their million-step challenge in our own way. After calculating how many steps each takes to walk one mile, we are aiming to collectively walk 75,000 steps walking from school to Faceby church and back on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> July. ## Class 2

Class 2 have had another hard-working start to this half term and are enjoying their new topics 'Beast Creator' and 'Wriggle and Crawl'. This week, we have been observing closely the life cycle of our class caterpillars! We cannot wait to welcome butterflies into their habitat!

Within English, the children have completed wonderful stories based on the 'Incredible Book Eating Boy' as well as reading and sharing 'James and the Giant Peach'.

Within Maths, we have continued with our 'measures' topic. The children have enjoyed a range of practical activities, using scales to weigh different items as well as measuring amounts of water using standard and non-standard units of measure. The children thoroughly enjoyed these activities and have shown great enthusiasm!



In PE, we have enjoyed taking part in the Stokesley Cluster Athletics virtual competitions and preparing for our Sports Days. We have also enjoyed continuing to take part in the Get Set Tokyo challenge. We are now making our way to Tokyo for the second time. ### The County Music Service provides tuition in a wide variety of instruments:

**Brass:** cornet, trumpet, trombone, tenor, euphonium, tuba; **Woodwind:** clarinet, flute, oboe, saxophone, bassoon; **Strings:** violin, viola, cello, double bass; **Guitars:** classical, acoustic, electric; **Percussion:** tuned percussion and kit; **Voice** and **Keyboard/piano**

Up to **32 lessons per year** are offered to pupils in small groups or individual lessons. These take place mostly during the school day and are available to pupils attending schools throughout North Yorkshire. Lessons are sometimes available beyond the end of the school day or on Saturdays at music centres. **Rotating Timetables** allow for minimal disruption to the school day. **Regular contact** through **Practice Diaries** and **Termly Reports** ensure that parents are in contact with the Teacher and can support their child's practice at home.

**Instruments are available to hire or can be bought using our assisted purchase scheme – see website for more details.**
