

EYFS

Our topic for the first part of this half term has been 'Dangerous Dinosaurs'. This exciting project teaches children about the different animals that roamed Earth millions of years ago and how they are related to animals that live on Earth today. We have learnt about dinosaurs using fact books and the internet, looked at real fossils and found out about the people and creatures that lived in Prehistoric times after the dinosaurs became extinct.







We were blown away by the amount of knowledge some children already had about dinosaurs! We saw lots of imaginative play and construction of habitats for small world dinosaurs. As palaeontologists, we excavated fossilised dinosaur eggs to find what was inside them. As scientists, we conducted volcano eruption experiments. As historians, we learnt about early humans, making charcoal on our fire at OWLS and using this to make cave drawings of animals.

We have now moved into our mini-project 'Puddles and Rainbows', which teaches children about the weather that happens during spring and allows them to explore natural phenomena, including

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rainbows. It supports them to explore colour in the natural world. The beautiful weather so far has made the puddle part of the topic a bit tricky (not that we're complaining!), but we have made good use of the sunshine by exploring how we can make rainbows with prisms. We have also been using the "Colour Monster" story to think about emotions.

In RE, Reception children are learning about the meaning of Easter and the important dates that lead up to this.

Key Stage 1



As we draw close to the end of another busy term, here is a brief update of our learning this half term from Bilsdale.

Our Reception children came back to discover two large eggs in the classroom. What was inside? We couldn't wait to find out. Eventually two very friendly dinosaurs appeared!

Lots of dinosaur fun has been had. We have learnt about when they roamed the earth, what they ate, how they defended themselves and what might have happened to them.

In KS1 we have continued our learning about kings and queens of Britain through the ages and have thoroughly enjoyed our latest writing units on hibernation and George and the Dragon. We have been investigating sliders, levers and linkages and will be creating cards with moving parts to conclude this project. Next week we will be celebrating the Easter story and will work together to make an Easter garden.

Hopefully, we will return to warmer weather, ready to continue our learning fun.

Class 2

Well done to all our pupils in Class 2 for a very hard-working half term.

We have worked so hard this term and have enjoyed learning about English and British monarchs from AD 871 to the present day. We have had great discussions in History, based on how the power of the monarchy has changed over time. We have studied six significant sovereigns: Alfred the Great, William the Conqueror, Henry VIII, Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria and the current monarch, Elizabeth II.

In reading, we have enjoyed learning about Queen Victoria and her magnificent bathing machine!

To celebrate World Book Day 2022, we enjoyed sharing our favourite stories with each other and writing a review on our book.

This term, we have thoroughly enjoyed our science lessons in Class 2. We have discussed how animals have offspring that grow into adults and have looked closely at various

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life cycles. It was great fun finding out what animals need to survive and then learning about balanced diets and exercise both of which are important for a healthy lifestyle.

The children have continued to have positive attitudes towards sport and have enjoyed learning how to keep healthy in PSHE. It has been great to see the children displaying and improving a range of ball and movement skills.

Key Stage 2

We have had a busy half term and learnt a lot.

We have enjoyed writing the next part of Beowulf. We have been successful at building tension and left the reader on a cliff-hanger of an ending.

Our Invasion history topic is coming to an end. We have learnt about different groups who lived in Britain and invaded our country. Did you know...

- Anglo Saxons invaded Britain because of floods in their country
- Some Anglo-Saxon place names still exist today e.g. Wednesbury which is named after the Anglo-Saxon god Woden
- Both Anglo Saxons and Vikings had a hierarchy
- Viking children did have toys made out of wood and bones
- Viking women took care of the house and cooked for the family
- King Athelstan united different kingdoms by defeating Scottish, Welsh and Viking kings so England became united
- Vikings invaded Britain between 793AD 870AD
- There were 16 kings between 924AD 1066AD

In Geography, we have learnt how to use four figure and six figure grid references, learnt about the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn and different climate zones. We have located countries in North and South America. We have selected two countries to study in more detail, one from each continent, and identified their physical and human features.

We have gathered information about different ways to keep food fresh. After analysing food labels, we have started to design our own packaging. We are looking forward to making some food and seeing if our packaging keeps the food fresh for a day.

Next term our topic is Misty Mountain Winding River.
