

News from the Classes

Carlton Class 1

Although we've had a cold and slightly snowy week, Class 1 have fully embraced the unforeseen weather conditions. On Wednesday morning we got our hats, coats and gloves on and headed out to see how the natural world changes when temperatures drop. Our snowy week has led to brilliant discussion around thermometers, degrees Celsius, national weather records and how to keep ourselves safe and warm during colder conditions.

The children could not contain their excitement when we noticed the water tray had frozen over! Each and every child explored the frost, ice and snow. This led to some brilliant vocabulary and the opportunity to learn new vocabulary such as 'transparent'. Here are just a few phrases I heard during all the excitement - "It's so shiny!" "The ice is see through" "Look it's smashed!" "Wow look it's cracked!"



Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

We have had another lovely week in Y1/2. In RE, we are continuing to enjoy discussing why Christians believe that Jesus' birth showed how he was extraordinary (for example, he is worshipped as a king, in Matthew's Gospel) and that he came to bring good news (for example, to the poor, in Luke's Gospel). It was great listening to Father David in Worship on Wednesday discussing why Christians celebrate Jesus' birth, and how for Christians, Advent is a time for getting ready for Jesus' coming.

In Science this week we have enjoyed learning that data can be sorted and displayed in different ways. We learned how to use a Carroll diagram to sort a range of animals into groups based on their physical characteristics. We had great fun and by the end of the session, we were able to answer the following questions: "How did you decide to put that animal in that box?" "Which part of your diagram has the most animals?" "What does this tell you?" "Are all the mammals in the same box?" "Why do you think they are there?" Well Done everyone!

Bilsdale KS2 and Carlton Class 3 & 4

This week children in KS2 at both Bilsdale and Carlton have been industrious and focussed, as we have enjoyed challenging ourselves to complete booklets on reading, maths, grammar and spelling, checking our learning and knowledge to this point in the term. The children have all demonstrated our vision and KIND attitudes to learning and we are very proud of their determination to always be 'their personal best'.

In both schools we have reached the conclusion of our latest writing unit, working on non-chronological reports. Children in Class 4 at Carlton and Bilsdale have researched and written pieces on octopuses, whilst children in Class 3 have discovered fascinating facts about porcupines. All this knowledge has been used to compose some interesting and informative reports on the chosen animal and has encouraged the children to draw on prior learning from our science work on animal nutrition and the skeletal system.

Everyone is looking forward to a new week of learning, continuing to discover more about life in the Iron Age and a new focus theme for our writing. Don't forget to keep practicing on TTRS and enjoy snuggling up during this cold weather with a great book to transport you to new and wonderful places!
