News from the Classes

Bilsdale

Do you ever think about how much processed food you are eating? Bilsdale KS1 and KS2 have been finding out about processed food and where food comes from. They learnt that a processed food is changed during preparation and includes processes, such as cooking, freezing, pasteurising, or the addition of ingredients. They found out there are different categories of processed foods, that ultra-processed foods have been through significant changes and have added ingredients and often a low nutritional value. They discovered the pros of processed foods which include convenience and availability and the cons which include a lack of nutrients and unhealthy ingredients. They made their own bread and compared it to processed bread exploring taste and texture, they will be able to tell you which they preferred. There was interesting discussion around white or brown bread. The children also took part in a Microbit workshop using coding which made them use applicable skills such as creativity, problem solving and persistence. They showed by the end of the session they could confidently face a variety of challenges and really impressed Mr Fogget who was running the workshop. The children's comments speak for themselves. "It was amazing, fun, interesting, I learnt a lot, incredible, I loved it, challenging, spectacular, inspiring, fantastic, joyful."

Carlton Class 1



With the lovely weather this week Class 1 have learnt all about the importance of keeping ourselves cool. We have dipped our toes in the quad, found lots of shady areas to play, ensured we kept our sun cream topped up and drank plenty of water! Class 1 did so incredibly well keeping themselves safe and hydrated in the heat - well done!

The Little Owls have done some incredible artwork with Mrs Pearey at the Wildlife Garden this week! Using a hammer and mallet the Little Owls foraged for natural resources to create these beautiful patterns on a thin fabric.

Following our topic 'The big wide world' we were going to explore different ways to travel this week. In order to really experience this, we planned on heading out and challenging ourselves on the balance bikes, scooters and other modes of transport. To our sur-

prise, we found a bird was nesting in our bike storage shed; therefore, to ensure we didn't disturb any wildlife, we plan on doing this over the next few weeks instead.

Carlton Class 2

Another glorious week in the sunshine and KS1 have been thriving! We would like to say a big well done to all our Year 1 Superstars! You have all worked so very hard on your phonics this week. In our reading sessions this week, we have enjoyed developing our prediction skills and enjoyed reading and sharing a new Oliver Jeffers book 'Stuck'. In Maths, we have been working on developing our quick recall of a range of addition facts. We have been challenging ourselves to be 3 seconds or less per fact. We are continuing to learn about Habitats in science and had great fun exploring the mysterious basket - a woodland habitat! It has been lovely to have the sunshine for our outdoor PE this week, we have demonstrated some amazing rounders skills.

Carlton Class 3

Did you know there are five places around your body where you can find your pulse? Class 3 tried counting their pulse on all five locations. Not all were easy to find but Class 3 were scientific in their approach, taking readings three times and then calculating the average. They took this skill into their next science lesson trying to prove the hypothesis "Children with lower resting heart rates can sprint faster than those with higher resting heart rates". There was great teamwork to organise the sprint, timing individual runs and partner work recording results on a scatter graph. Maths skills were applied to interpret the graph, identify if there was a correlation and to help draw the final conclusion. If you want to know if the hypothesis was true or false, ask Class 3!


