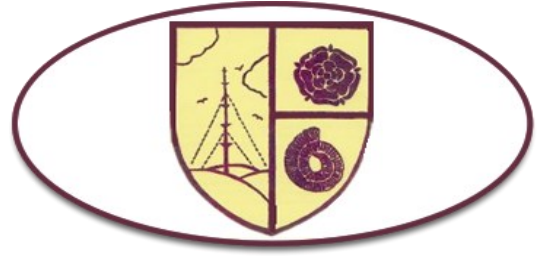

News from the Classes

Bilsdale

Bilsdale have enjoyed geography and science this week. KS1 found out about the ways in which the environment is being damaged and the problems this damage will cause for people in the future thinking of ideas about how the environment can be protected. KS2 explored the question 'How are climate change and extreme weather affecting people's lives around the world?' They also looked at world trade - they discovered that Ecuador exports a vast number of bananas due to the tropical climate and fertile soils enabling bananas to be grown all year. They found out that 90% of toys are made in China and that Germany exports a vast number of cars due to its long history of car manufacturing and reputation. In science, KS1 continued to complete their exercise challenge and joined KS2 to measure heart rates and find their pulse in one of five different places. KS2 completed the enquiry explored by Carlton last week. "Children with lower resting heart rates can sprint faster than those with higher resting heart rates." They came up with lots of predictions and good discussion work. Finally, everyone has had great fun playing cricket on the field at break times.

Carlton Class 1



Class 1 have had a very exciting week this week! We have had our first school trip to the Church at Carlton, St Botolph's. The children were a credit to our school. They were respectful to the Church, the artefacts within it, and Father Robert who kindly showed us round. The children were so curious and had many questions which they were confident enough to ask. We have learnt so much about our local Church! Additionally, before heading out we had a chat about road safety. The children could tell us all about the Green Cross Code and we practised stopping, looking and listening as we walked along. All in all, a lovely trip out for Class 1 with lovely memories made.



Carlton Class 2

What a hot, sunny week we have had! In English, we have continued to enjoy learning about 'Movers and Shakers' by writing a non-chronological report based on Neil Armstrong. We thought carefully about which words to use to make our writing really interesting. In Year 1 maths we have been counting to 50. In Year 2 we have been using positional and directional language. We have enjoyed learning about living and non-living things in science. We had great fun spotting these in our school grounds. Year 1 loved their forest school session this week, while Year 2 showed great improvement at swimming. Have a great weekend!



Carlton Class 3

It was Carlton's turn for the Microbit workshop this week. This was a really enjoyable session with the children quickly learning new skills and successfully using coding to turn the Microbit into a dice randomly generating numbers, light sensor and motion sensor. Programming the device to see their name scroll was a particular highlight. We've been marching along with maths this week with Y3/4 completing units on shape. They both have statistics next whilst Y5 learn how to convert units and Y6 continue with problem solving and investigations.

KS2 across the federation

To celebrate National Windrush Day on June 22nd, KS2 classes in both schools have been discovering the 4,000 mile journey on HM Empire Windrush that 500 Caribbean people made in 1948. They came in answer to adverts placed by the British Government, offering homes, jobs and a warm welcome as they helped to rebuild a Britain battered by WW2.

Leaving a bright, vibrant sun-soaked home environment, what did these brave families find to be their reality when beginning a new life in the UK? After our research lots of amazing, thoughtful discussions, questions and written pieces have demonstrated an insight and understanding of what life was actually like.
