News from the Classes

Bilsdale

Bilsdale children have enjoyed another busy week. KS1 have started a new maths block about position and direction. They went outside to explore how they can turn a full turn, half turn, quarter turn and three-quarter turn. They have finished writing their biographies of Neil Armstrong and begun finding out facts about James Cook. The highlight of the week was a trip to the Captain Cook museum. They found out lots of information about James Cook's early life and his life as an explorer.

In history, KS2 have continued researching life as an enslaved African, focusing on revolt, resistance and revolution. They have examined sources of evidence, looked at the consequences of slave revolts and discovered how ultimately they led to the abolition of slavery. Some amazing discussion and thoughtful questions sprang from their findings. In Art they have continued to study works by some significant trailblazers recreating their favourite piece looking at colour, tone and perspective. Year 5 and 6 have worked really hard on their circulatory system double page spreads which are informative and beautifully presented. They are deservedly proud of what they have achieved.

Carlton Class 1

Wow! What an amazing half term Class 1 have had. Each and every child has delved into our topic - Ready, Steady, Grow! The children have loved planting their own seeds, exploring natural resources, painting just like Vincent Van Gough, watching our tiny caterpillars grow their chrysalis and, just yesterday, turn into beautiful butterflies! Reception have taken the four Painted Lady butterflies

to the wildlife garden and released them this afternoon.

Class 1 have been set a challenge! All of Class 1 have taken home their sunflower seeds in pots. We ask that each child cares for their plant and keeps an eye on how tall it grows. The aim is to get your sunflower growing taller than you are! Please keep us updated on Tapestry or bring into school any pictures of your child's beautiful sunflower. We can't wait to see!

Our topic for next half term is 'The Big Wide World'. This project teaches children about the global community to which they belong and explores how living things, communities and climates differ around the world. We can't wait to get started! We wish you a relaxing half term, all ready to get started again for the final term of the school year!

Carlton Class 2



This week started with an end of term celebration of skills at Forest School. The children took part in a range of activities from fire lighting and den building to clay sculpture making. The children all worked very hard in their teams. On Tuesday, we enjoyed a visit to the Captain Cook Birthplace Museum to find out about Captain Cook, a local and historically significant figure. We all had a great day and learned so much. Back at school, we had fun writing recounts.



Carlton Class 3

Inspired by our class novel 'Kick' about Budi a keen footballer who works in a football boot factory in Jakarta, the class have become passionate campaigners about child labour including writing letters to persuade Premier League footballers and sponsors to use kit made in Child Labour Free Zones. Learning about poverty, comparing wages to footballer's salary, considering who profits and thinking about childhood and education has led to interesting class conversations and these ideas have been captured in the strongly worded letters. Amazing writing Class 3, well done!
