In the Bible, Psalm 46 is a noisy Psalm.

It talks about waters roaring and mountains quaking, about wars and desolation. But it ends with God saying, 'Be still and know that I am God'. Be still. Israel and Gaza are noisy with the sounds of war at the moment... with tanks and bombs and guns and people shouting.

Wherever you are right now, close your eyes and try to sit quietly without moving... for a whole minute if you can. As you sit quietly like this, if you want to, you can say a silent prayer for stillness, for peace in the Middle East.

News from the Classes

Bilsdale

We have had another busy and productive week at Bilsdale. KS2 have completed the writing unit on Skara Brae and are now ready to work on editing and redrafting ready for publication. They have become skilled at the art of persuasion. In History KS2 have looked at how Stone Age tools and weapons improved, developed, and became more sophisticated and efficient over time. KS1 have started working on their recount of their trip to Beamish and have been able to develop their understanding of the past. In Science KS2 have researched animal diets and have looked at how in the wild, animals' diets change over the year with the seasons due to certain foods becoming available or unavailable. KS1 have continued their work on plants finding out about bulbs and seeds. KS2 were able to take part in a virtual session about Judaism and synagogues asking some excellent questions and learning a lot from the answers. Both KS1 and KS2 have worked on safety in computing; KS1 have worked on the importance of keeping information, such as their usernames and passwords, private. KS2 worked on identifying secure sites by looking for privacy seals of approval and the benefits and risks of giving personal information and device access to different software.

Carlton Class 1

A wonderful week! We have had the most lovely week in Class 1, a particular highlight has been the range of Autumnal resources we have had to explore and engage in. Our conker run in the quad was a huge hit, all the children loved covering their conkers in paint, then rolling them down the ramp and watching as the paint made beautiful patterns on the paper. We have also enjoyed opening up a pumpkin and exploring the insides! Some children chose to take a seed from inside home with them, to have ago at growing their own pumpkins. We are already looking forward to next week.

Carlton Class 2

We have had another great week of learning in Class 2! In Maths, we have been ordering and comparing numbers. On Wednesday, Year 2 enjoyed the challenge of supporting Year 1 when identifying which quantity was greater, explaining their reasoning. Everyone was able to use the language of 'more than' and fewer than' in the context of quantity. In English, we have been learning to proofread our independent writing and ensure the correct use of capital letters and full stops.

As part of our work in Computing this week we have enjoyed learning about online safety. We listened to the story of 'Smartie the Penguin' before making Online Safety Flap Books. In our art session, we continued to learn about the work of James Rizzi. We had great fun creating a 3D effect by layering.

We would like to thank Dylan and Elma for creating their own natural potions at home inspired by their work in Forest School. Well done everyone for a super week!

Carlton Class 3

We have had another enjoyable week in Class 3. The children have been eager to continue with our writing unit on Skara Brae and are now challenging themselves to further deepen their sentences, adding a growing and impressive range of adventurous vocabulary. As our work on the Neolithic period of the Stone Age is ending, we had messy fun creating clay Bell Beaker Pots, adding linear repeating patterns to decorate. Our history theme has certainly captured the children's imaginations and we are excited to continue the journey into the Bronze Age. Well done to those children who have had creative fun at home, building their own versions of Stonehenge!

In Science the children have studied their food diaries and thought about which food groups they perhaps need to increase, ensuring they get a healthy and balanced diet throughout the week. We have explored animal's diets and have looked at how they have adapted to catch and eat their food or prey. Using four-figure and six-figure grid co-ordinates to find locations on maps has been the geography focus this week, with the class having fun identifying Ordnance Survey symbols and plotting the course of a dragon across an imaginary landscape.

One of our favourite lessons of the week has been a virtual meeting to discover more about Judaism and synagogues. The children enjoyed discovering the answers to questions they had compiled prior to this event.

After meeting 'Buddy', the NSPCC mascot, the children thought about who their trusted adults are, how those adults make them feel and the many ways we can stay safe, both in and out of school and online. Some incredibly mature discussions and ideas were shared, and our school values and ethos shone through.

Carlton Class 4

Keeping safe has a been a theme this week. Online safety is our focus in computing. The children have played a game to remind themselves of safety features such as passwords, PEGI ratings and secure websites, and then created their own game. There were interesting discussions and ideas about the positives and negatives of location apps as to whether they kept someone safe or revealed their location putting them in danger. The children have also considered who their trusted adults are and considered ways to stay safe in different situations. These conversations will continue over the next few weeks as we approach darker evenings, Hallowe'en and Bonfire Night.

The children enjoyed our virtual meeting with Deanna from Newcastle Synagogue especially the opportunity to answer their questions. She enriched the children's understanding, helped with our pronunciation of Jewish words and read the Shema prayer in Hebrew.

Miss Baxendale is our music specialist who comes in on Fridays and is teaching the children to play either the flute or the clarinet. The children have learnt how to put their instrument together and take it apart. They have practised blowing to make a sound and they are looking forward to playing notes this week.


