

### **News from the Classes**

### Little Owls and Class 1

Class 1 enjoyed engaging in a brilliant Victorian workshop on Wednesday afternoon. They learnt some key facts and particularly enjoyed dressing up in outfits inspired by the Victorian era. The children were a credit to our school and listened so attentively. On Monday, Little Owls and some of our Reception class explored measuring capacity and made their own playdough. After preparing the provision earlier that morning and leaving the ingredients out for the children to independently explore, they chose to group together and make this into a team effort. They were very patient, taking turns and allowed each other to mix, stir and knead. A lovely week for Class 1, we are looking forward to our tea party next week! ### Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

The children have had another really busy week. In English, we have continued using the excellent 'The Crow's Tale' by Naomi Howarth to inspire our work. The children have been learning to use onomatopoeia in their writing, for example, 'The crow began his long journey home through terrible weather. CRASH! HOWL! ROAR! The storm was angry'. We had great fun listening to a soundscape of a storm to support our writing.

In history, we enjoyed learning about the meaning of the term 'power' and 'rule'. We had great fun finding out who was the most powerful monarch. We learned that William the Conqueror had absolute power and King William of Orange and Queen Mary 111 had less power. They created a constitutional monarchy like we have today.

In RE, we had a thoughtful discussion on the question: Is God forgiving? We listened to the parable of the Unforgiving Servant (Luke 6:37-38) and learned that forgiveness from God is good news.

A great week of learning everyone. Well done!



### Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

After a busy schedule of events out of school last week, KS2 have this week returned to the classroom raring to go. After our writing unit focusing on 'The Street Beneath My Feet' we have turned our attention to diving deep into the depths of the ocean, implementing our explanation writing skills for our independent work, using another of Charlotte Guillain's beautifully illustrated books, 'The Sea Below My Toes'. The children have been fascinated by the weird and wonderful array of creatures found in each level of the ocean. They have discovered amazing facts about the ocean's levels; from the Sunlight Zone, where we can dibble our toes on a hot summer's day and where most sea life is to be found, to the dark and largely unexplored depths of the Abyssal Zone and Challenger Deep, where little can survive, and hydrothermal vent bubbles heated by magma cause an unusual heat.

In French, Years 3 and 4 have been busy learning the names of ten vegetables and how to ask for a kilo of their favourites. Years 5 and 6 have been learning different weather types, how to ask and answer, 'What is the weather like today?' and studying some of the major cities in France, the compass points and how to read a weather map. They have asked questions about the weather in the North, South, East, West and centre of the country. All have developed their understanding, confidence and pronunciation over the term and have participated with enjoyment.

Our science this week has continued to investigate forces. Children have taken measurements of push/pull forces in standard units using force meters, and have compared how a variety of shoes move over surfaces, investigating which sole provides the best grip. They now understand that friction is a force between two surfaces as they move over each other, that smooth surfaces usually generate less friction than rough surfaces and that friction slows down a moving object.

In art, the children have taken their initial detailed sketches of ammonites, created a simplified motif and have used this motif pattern to create effective one and two-colour prints. Children used polystyrene printing tiles to make a relief print, by carefully drawing and scratching their motif pattern onto the tile. Incredibly sticky printing inks were then rolled onto their tiles and a paper print was lifted off, revealing the pattern in glorious block colours.

Many examples of our KIND vision have been demonstrated throughout the week and the children are already looking forward to next week.
