

Little Owls and Class 1

The past half-term has absolutely flown by! Our enriching topic of 'Dangerous Dinosaurs' has been such a hit with all the children and really opened up our perspective to understanding the world, past and present and the natural world. Although we've used some challenging vocabulary, tricky pronunciation and complex concepts, the children have taken it their stride and naturally picked this up. The outstanding role play has really stood out this half-term, including the way the children have applied dinosaur role play into all areas of learning - even PE! Both Reception and the Little Owls have enjoyed all the stories we have read throughout this half-term but a definite favourite was the 'Dinosaur Hide and Seek' story sack we mysteriously found wrapped up in our classroom on World Book Day, we are still on the hunt for the person that put it there...

We can't wait to see what mysteries, challenges and exploring next half-term holds! Our next topic is Sunshine and Sunflowers...this seasonal project provides opportunities for outdoor learning and teaches children how to care for the plants and animals in their local environment and how to stay safe in the sun.

SUNFLOWERS FROM UKRAINE

Helianthus Annus or Sunyashnikus in Ukrainian.

The glorious heads of sunflowers have long been a symbol of hope and life in Ukraine and have been grown for 200 years.

The challenge is to produce a sunflower using a paper plate.

You can use any materials you choose and any method to create your sunflower, e.g collage - painting - gluing - knitting crochet - mosaic, it is entirely your choice as long as it fits the plate.

<u>Clearly print your name, school and age on the reverse of the</u> plate, it might be easier to do this before you decorate it.

Accompany your entry with a short description about sunflowers and how you created your entry.

Prize will be awarded after Easter and to the school growing the tallest sunflower in September.

Return your sunflower plate to school the week after the Easter holiday.

Four local primary schools are participating.

In May the schools will be given sunflower seeds to see which school can grow the tallest sunflower.
