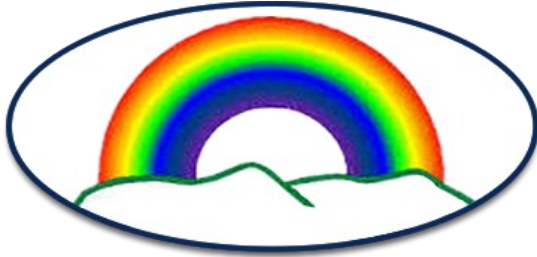

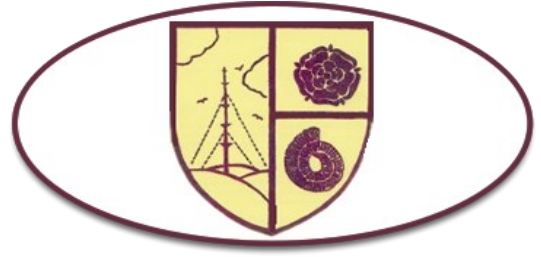

News from the Classes

Little Owls and Class 1

Class 1 have spent this week exploring in the lovely weather. We have been observing our plants and making sure we tend to them, particularly with the warmer weather. The Little Owls have been practising their counting, cutting and sticking with jars of bugs. Each Little Owl has carefully cut their preferred bugs and stuck them into a jar. They have even had a go at writing how many bugs are in the jar! Reception also began learning about baptism in RE and how this relates to belonging. We have had some brilliant questions and some sustained shared thinking.

Finally, some sunshine! On Tuesday afternoon we headed out into quad to learn about the physical process of erosion and how the coastline erodes. We had great fun watching how waves cause coastal erosion. We looked carefully at the waves of water as they hit the sand and were able to describe what was happening.

In mathematics, Year 2 have continued to learn about fractions and Year 1 have consolidated their work on multiplication and division by recapping counting in 2s, 5s and 10s as well as creating and sharing amounts into equal groups.

In English this week, we started learning about the shapes of a non-chronological report based on a pirate report. We had a great lesson researching pirates to feed into our writing.

In PE, we loved having the opportunity to continue our hard work in athletics - watch out for us at sports day, our sprinting skills are very impressive!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

Moving on from comparing the Minoan and Mycenaean periods, KS2 revisited the Greek timeline to show and discuss the chronology, place and duration of the Greek Dark Age and Archaic period. To help them understand how these periods were different from those that had gone before, they listened to a Dark Age and Archaic period podcast audio. They delved more deeply into both periods, considering similarities and differences between them and across the four periods studied so far; finding out that the world's first democracy developed in Athens during the Greek Archaic period (5th century BC), and people from different city states came together for festivals and games, including the first Olympic Games. Classroom countdowns to this year's Olympic Games are noted carefully each day.

In maths, Year 3 have been finishing their work on fractions while Year 4 are working on decimals. Year 5 and 6 have completed shape, position, and direction exploring rotation, translation and reflection.

After another busy week, the children are all hoping for a sunny weekend to enjoy - fingers crossed!

On Tuesday all the Year 3 and 4 children from both our schools went to a Cricket day at Stokesley Cricket Club. We were able to play two teams, Carlton Red and Carlton White. We did a few warmups and then quickly began to play against the other two schools, Hutton Rudby and Kirby & Great Broughton. It was loads of fun working as a team and everyone wanted each other to do well. It was good fun because the coaches there were really nice and encouraging. We all played in boy - girl pairs and took it in turn to field or to bat. Loads of great sportsmanship and great teamwork went on throughout the day. I think we had all improved our cricket skills by the afternoon. At the end of the day, we had all tried our best, had fun and even though we didn't come first, it really didn't matter. It was very enjoyable and we would certainly go again.
