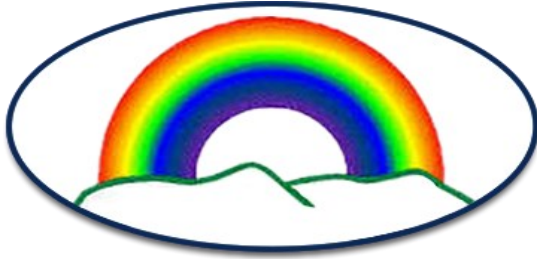

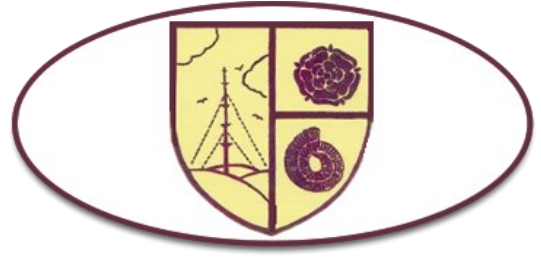

News from the Classes

Little Owls and Class 1

We have had a lovely final week of the half term in Class 1. Over the past 7 weeks we have explored sunshine and sunflowers, grown our own plants, cared for them and learnt everything required to help them grow. Our topic has allowed us to learn all the different parts of a flower aided by our favourite song 'flower, stem, leaves and roots'. Each child will be bringing their plants home at some point and we'd love to know how they grow! Please pop any changes on Tapestry, anything the children have noticed and how tall they get! I wonder if they will grow taller than 10cm? This is our target agreed as a class.

We look forward to our next topic 'On the Beach'. Please find a little optional task in reading wallets/ Little Owl diaries. This will help give children a strong start next half-term. This project teaches children about the plants and animals that live at the seaside. It also explores holidays in the past and the importance of keeping safe in the sun.

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

What a fantastic end to this half term! We have thoroughly enjoyed our week despite the wet weather. The children created some amazing artwork this week— we were given a challenge to create an incredible insect inspired water-coloured painting. We were so very proud of your insects.

In maths we have come to the end of our work on fractions, just in time to start our new topic on time. We have also written some pirate reports in our writing. After such a busy week we are all ready for a break, have a lovely half term everyone.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

Over the past few weeks in English, the children have been retelling a Greek myth, 'Theseus and the Minotaur'. The children have greatly enjoyed this story with plot twists, acts of deception, characters showing different traits, a labyrinth, a mythical creature and a tragic ending. This week, as an independent write, the children have written Theseus' diary; composing three diary entries relating to three significant plot points. There has been some fabulous writing with children taking on the character of Theseus including his thoughts and feelings about events in the story. There are many more Greek myths for the children to enjoy. Perhaps over half term they could find out more about Perseus the Gorgon Slayer, Helen of Troy and the Trojan horse, Jason and the Argonauts or even write their own Greek myth.

Autism & Anxiety

Training Opportunity in North Yorkshire

Autistic children can seem more anxious than other children, partly due to the world being an uncertain and sometimes unsafe place for them and partly that they experience sensory and emotional experiences differently. This can have a huge impact on their mental health.

This course will examine how anxiety can affect autistic young people, what that might look like in their behaviour and how we can support them to feel safe and manage uncertainty. We will explore co-regulation and self-regulation strategies that can enable them to feel more in control and confident in different situations.

What will you learn:

- That anxiety is not what you see, and how we can interpret the anxiety behind some behaviour and masking.
- That an autistic person sees the world through an autistic lens and how that can help us develop the right support to help them feel safe and confident.
- That teaching about the science of sensory systems and emotional responses can help an autistic person manage being anxious.
- That we have a big part to play in making school and the wider world feel safe for autistic people.
- That there are lots of autism friendly resources you can use to support autistic children in school and at home.
- That working together is key, starting with the child's voice.

Training led by: Lynn McCann

Lynn McCann is the author of five books for teachers about supporting autistic children and young people. She is an independent specialist teacher based in the Northwest of England.. She and her team, work from pupil voices, always putting the child at the heart of all they do and supporting young people in primary, secondary and other settings. Lynn has many years' experience of working with anxious autistic young people and has delivered training around autism and mental health for many years. Her company, Reachout ASC Ltd, has autistic people on the team who help develop this training.

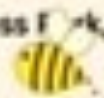
