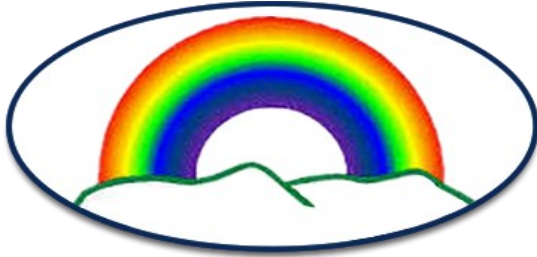

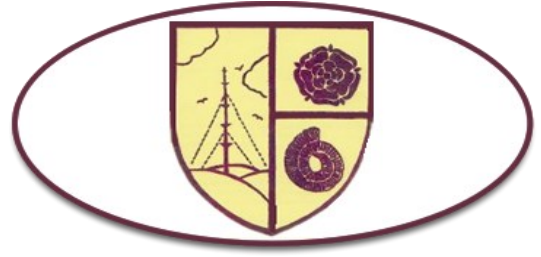

News from the Classes

Little Owls and Class 1

This week has been all about shape in Class 1. Reception have been matching and having a go at drawing various shapes. Little Owls have been exploring the shapes we have out in our provision, both 2D and 3D. We have searched our classroom and the quad to find shapes everywhere. The children have been brilliant at spotting shapes and can identify what makes a 2D shape and what makes a 3D shape. While at Wisdom of the Woods, Class 1 spotted some rabbits skipping around, the children spent a long time watching one and in turn it watched us back! Well done Class 1.

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

This week started off with lots of excitement with the arrival of one of our butterflies, named Miracle. It was a long but happy wait! After the arrival of Miracle, came the arrival of a second butterfly on Wednesday!

In English this week, both Year 1 and 2 have enjoyed concluding their work on 'Song of the Sea' by planning and writing our own stories based on a magical under the sea adventure.

In mathematics, Year 2 have been learning to recognise, name and write fractions and Year 1 have continued their counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and made equal groups to count.

In geography, we had great fun reading keys. We learned how to identify the symbols on a map and understood that each one represents a physical or human feature.

In PE, we have enjoyed the challenge of running a mile and have also practised our sprinting techniques in athletics.



Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

Sunshine at last! The children have had yet another very productive week and enjoyed the warmer weather, which always puts a smile on our faces.

We have thoroughly enjoyed the beginning of our new writing unit, the myth of 'Theseus and the Minotaur'. Children have explored the differing personalities of the kings, Aegeus and Minos, and begun to think about the ways in which the Gods caused havoc on earth from their home high up on Mount Olympus. The monstrous Minotaur has fired imaginations, and some adventurous vocabulary is being used to good effect. We can't wait to continue to see where the myth will take our writing journey.

In art we are studying expressionism and have focussed on Edvard Munch, one of the most significant Expressionism artists. 'The Scream' is one of his most familiar works and depicts the artist's feelings of anxiety. Children have learnt that this art movement used jagged, distorted lines and contrasting colours to paint compositions which portrayed a range of extreme emotions, and that Expressionism is a style of art which aims to express these emotions, rather than physical reality. They have studied their own expressions and chosen an art piece by Munch which in some way 'spoke to them' and recreated it, attempting to use the colour palette he worked from. There are some colourful and creative interpretations in progress.
