

## **News from the Classes**

## Little Owls and Class 1

What a busy week in Class 1! This week, we have learned about Remembrance Day and enjoyed using poppies in maths when subitising 4 and 5. We enjoyed our first gymnastics session in PE. We explored being champion gymnasts and completing a simple routine containing two different balances. In Phonics, we have continued to enjoy the adventures of 'Nip and Nap' and have learned Hh and Bb phonemes and graphemes. We are settling into our new theme for this half term, based on 'A Starry Night', we enjoyed listening to a clip based on what happens when we fall asleep. We discussed a range of images in the clip, including those of the moon, stars, night -time animals, bedtimes and people who work at night. We then sorted the picture cards into daytime and night-time. Excitingly, this week, we have started to practise Christmas songs for our Nativity. More details to follow about this!

## Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

We have enjoyed another busy week of learning in Class 2 this week. The children have often demonstrated our value of compassion, they have discussed many ways to show kindness and empathy and loved showing off their odd socks on Tuesday! Our report writing has introduced onomatopoeic words and alliteration, which the children have transferred to their own written ideas brilliantly. Some mindfulness mandala creating kept us all very busy in Forest School, with our Year 2 children taking the lead and developing their leadership and discussion skills. In geography we are learning about settlements, discussing the differences between villages, towns and cities and are consolidating our knowledge of the countries of the United Kingdom, including capital cities. We explored the school environment, looking for different materials inside and out, discussing some of their properties and whether they were natural or human-made.

## Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

We had a fantastic day at Jorvik yesterday. The children were amazed at the artefacts, fascinated by the Viking town and enjoyed being archaeologists digging and identifying objects from different periods in the past. We were surprised to discover how some of the Viking medicines were similar to those used today. Vikings used honey and water to soothe a sore throat and willow bark for a headache. The same chemical in willow is in our modern day pain relief tablets. Ask your children how cobwebs, maggots and leeches were used. The children behaved impeccably, particularly with their respectful listening, politeness to the coach driver and managed the short walks through the city centre beautifully. Well done KS2, we are very proud of you.

Hugo: The best bit was going on the ride. It helped seeing the Viking town and Viking life.

Arthur: The best part was the dig because I found replica objects. Isabel: I know now that Viking towns were very, very different.











## **Autism & Anxiety**

## Training Opportunity in North Yorkshire

Autistic children can seem more anxious than other children, partly due to the world being an uncertain and sometimes unsafe place for them and partly that they experience sensory and emotional experiences differently. This can have a huge impact on their mental health.

This course will examine how anxiety can affect autistic young people, what that might look like in their behaviour and how we can support them to feel safe and manage uncertainty. We will explore co-regulation and self-regulation strategies that can enable them to feel more in control and confident in different situations.

## What will you learn:

- That anxiety is not what you see, and how we can interpret the anxiety behind some behaviour and masking.
- That an autistic person sees the world through an autistic lens and how that can help us develop the right support to help them feel safe and confident.
- That teaching about the science of sensory systems and emotional responses can help an autistic person manage being anxious.
- That we have a big part to play in making school and the wider world feel safe for autistic people.
- That there are lots of autism friendly resources you can use to support autistic children in school and at home.
- That working together is key, starting with the child's voice.

## Training led by: Lynn McCann

Lynn McCann is the author of five books for teachers about supporting autistic children and young people. She is an independent specialist teacher based in the Northwest of England.. She and her team, work from pupil voices, always putting the child at the heart of all they do and supporting young people in primary, secondary and other settings. Lynn has many years' experience of working with anxious autistic young people and has delivered training around autism and mental health for many years. Her company, Reachout ASC Ltd, has autistic people on the team who help develop this training.
