



## **News from the Classes**

## Little Owls and Class 1

It has been a busy but enjoyable first week back in Class 1. The children have settled back into school life brilliantly. It has been lovely to see lots of smiles coming into school and hearing all about their half term adventures. We have been incredibly impressed with the children's blending in phonics. It has been great to see lots of reading taking place at home during the half term break. Well done everyone, keep it up!

In maths, we have been focusing on our counting skills and have enjoyed exploring the 'five-ness of 5' using one hand and the die pattern for 5. On Monday afternoon, our reception children enjoyed getting outside and enjoying the autumn sunshine with Mr Sims for their forest school session. Little Owls enjoyed starting our new topic based on 'Starry Night' by exploring the story 'Peace at Last'. The children had great fun role playing 'time for bed'.

The children demonstrated brilliant listening skills during art and were very enthusiastic when creating their fireworks pictures - there were lots of sparkles!

## Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

What a lovely first week back we have had in Class 2. The children were eager to share their news from half term, including exciting activities, bonfires and fireworks. We have discussed why we use the poppy as a symbol of remembrance and have enjoyed some poppy finger painting. Our new writing unit is using toys from the past as the stimulus and children have begun to write their timeline of toys, from the 1950s to the 1980s. In maths we are busy with addition of three 1-digit numbers and finding the parts. The children are using 'Hit the Button' to increase their rapid recall of number bonds to 10 or to 20, which will help them as their maths learning continues. Thank you for your continued support with reading at home over the holiday. It is super to see how eager the children are to read to an adult in the room and the increasing confidence as the term has progressed. They are enjoying sharing stories and reading to each other in the mornings - it is great for us to listen to them! Our first Forest School session was thoroughly enjoyed, but may I take this opportunity to remind you again of the importance of 'layering up'. The weather is now colder, so please send appropriate items of clothing and footwear for a Monday afternoon outside, thank you.

## Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

A new half term brings new topics in some subjects. In science, we begin work on sound, 'Celebrating Difference' is our topic in PSHE and in French, Y3/4 learn language associated with animals whilst Y5/6 learn the vocabulary for family. Our new writing unit is a quest story based on 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. We have considered Arthur's characteristics and our focus throughout this writing unit is how we can show, not tell, the reader these characteristics and associated feelings. "How do you know the character is curious/brave/scared?" are good questions to ask children when they read at home as these help the children to develop inference skills and subsequently apply this to their own writing.

In history we are completing work on the Anglo-Saxons using different sources of evidence to deduce their everyday life and we have considered their legacy. Next week we begin work on the next group of invaders - the Vikings. The children are very much looking forward to their visit to the Jorvik centre next Thursday.

## Wrap-up Middlesbrough

A huge thank you to all parents and carers who donated old coats to the Wrap-up Middlesbrough appeal, we collected over 40 garments. These will be donated to the charity to help those in need this winter.

# **Autism & Anxiety**

## Training Opportunity in North Yorkshire

Autistic children can seem more anxious than other children, partly due to the world being an uncertain and sometimes unsafe place for them and partly that they experience sensory and emotional experiences differently. This can have a huge impact on their mental health.

This course will examine how anxiety can affect autistic young people, what that might look like in their behaviour and how we can support them to feel safe and manage uncertainty. We will explore co-regulation and self-regulation strategies that can enable them to feel more in control and confident in different situations.

## What will you learn:

- That anxiety is not what you see, and how we can interpret the anxiety behind some behaviour and masking.
- That an autistic person sees the world through an autistic lens and how that can help us develop the right support to help them feel safe and confident.
- That teaching about the science of sensory systems and emotional responses can help an autistic person manage being anxious.
- That we have a big part to play in making school and the wider world feel safe for autistic people.
- That there are lots of autism friendly resources you can use to support autistic children in school and at home.
- That working together is key, starting with the child's voice.

## Training led by: Lynn McCann

Lynn McCann is the author of five books for teachers about supporting autistic children and young people. She is an independent specialist teacher based in the Northwest of England.. She and her team, work from pupil voices, always putting the child at the heart of all they do and supporting young people in primary, secondary and other settings. Lynn has many years' experience of working with anxious autistic young people and has delivered training around autism and mental health for many years. Her company, Reachout ASC Ltd, has autistic people on the team who help develop this training.

Adult Learning North Yorkshire is offering a free online course, 'Supporting Your Child with Key Stage 2 Maths'.


