

News from the Classes

Little Owls and Class 1

The children have jumped straight back into learning in Class 1 with such enthusiasm. We have seen fantastic listening, kind teamwork and lots of happy faces as we start our exciting new topic for the summer term: Sunshine and Sunflowers.

<u>Exploring the Great Outdoors - This week</u>, we have become gardeners in training! The children have been exploring the school grounds, learning to recognise different plants, trees and flowers, and even helping to clear out the school raised flower beds - all ready for planting. The children have loved getting stuck in, digging, weeding and preparing the soil.

As part of our new topic, we will be planting our own sunflower seeds and watching them grow over the coming weeks. Through this, the children will learn about what plants need to grow, the parts of a plant and the importance of taking care of living things.

There's so much to look forward to this term - from creative sunflower art and nature walks, to stories, songs and even some gardening inspired maths and phonics. We can't wait to see how much the children grow - just like their sunflowers!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

How lovely to see the children back together after our Easter holiday. Everyone came in with smiles and news to share, eager to discover what the final term holds in store. A few children seem to have grown taller - Noah proudly announced that he has 'had a growth sprout', and all have come back with positive attitudes and eagerness to do and be their best - well done everyone.

This week we have started our new unit of learning in geography, 'Let's Explore the World'. We have explored and navigated atlases, using them to answer questions about different continents around the world. The children worked with a partner and enjoyed the challenge of using the contents and index pages to help them find the answers, with lots of amazing discussion and remembering of facts from previous learning throughout the afternoon. In science we have discussed what makes us a human and what we need to survive. Our English unit is a biography of Malala Yousafzai, using 'Malala's Magic Pencil', the true story of one girl's wish for a better world as our stimulus. The children were horrified to learn that for millions of children around the world education is neither a right or a possibility. They all wished they could have a magic pencil to help others.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

The children have returned with a spring in their step, refreshed and ready to learn. Diving into our new geography topic, 'Misty Mountain Winding River', the children have already become very knowledgeable about rivers learning new vocabulary such as tributary, confluence, meander and estuary and been able to identify these features on river diagrams. They have learnt that the journey of a river can be divided into three different stages, the upper course, middle course and lower course and the differences between these in terms of the flow of the river and river features. Our first writing unit of the term is poetry. Reading 'The River' by Valerie Bloom, the children used their new river knowledge to explain the personification and comparisons to the river being called 'wandered, baby and dancer'. They have identified the structure and rhyming pattern within the poem so we are ready to write our own next week.


