Little Owls and Class 1

We started our week with a new story - 'The Growing Story' is about a little boy who is desperate to grow. Throughout the year, he can see his puppy and his chicks growing. The grass grows, flowers grow, leaves grow on trees and the corn he planted in spring grows, but is he growing too? We all enjoyed a great discussion based on how things grow and change before Reception completed a brave writing sentence based on the story. It was lovely seeing the children doing brave writing - writing the boy's name: Tom. Everyone could remember that names have a capital letter at the start including their own names! The children all were able to label a picture of an item that grows and changes and could correctly spot Mrs Cawthra's error when labelling her picture of a bud by using their fantastic phonological skills.

As part of our topic 'Long Ago', we have had great fun learning about toys from the past. We talked about the toys that children had to play with and how they differ from the toys we have today. Little Owls enjoyed looking at a selection of teddy bears and used the bears to sing teddy bear rhymes, such as Ten in the Bed and Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear.

Throughout the week, we have all been inspired by the School Council's Great Bird Watch and loved being creative - we made our own paper plate birds.

An incredible week of learning in Class 1- well done everyone!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

What a busy week of learning in Class 2! We have begun a new writing unit on 'The Seasons', following the story of a sycamore tree through the year and discovering all the wildlife that makes the tree its home, shelter or food source. The children loved finding out about the Sycamore Moth Caterpillar, and were intrigued by its furry appearance, movements and its flamboyant, vivid colourings.

In D.T. the children have progressed with their investigations of wheels, axles and chassis. They worked collaboratively to create simple vehicles, adding the wheels and axles to the body. Could they make it move? What a challenge it proved. Some wheels were too small, some too high on the chassis, some simply fell off! More investigating and further design adaptations to come next week.

On Thursday we loved arriving in our red, white and blue clothing. We read the story 'All Are Welcome' by Alexandra Penfold and from that discussed how we are all different and unique; how we could include everyone, no matter what skin colour, hair or eye colour, religions or beliefs. The children created their own hand print, showing what makes them unique. After some fantastic discussion throughout the day around tolerance, the children each made a paper chain link to show their understanding of what that means to us in our daily lives. The message we have all taken away from our British Values Day is to treat others as we would want to be treated ourselves.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

We've had a busy first half of the week with the children starting a new writing unit, a biography on Hatshepsut (ask your child about some amazing facts about this pharaoh) and a new maths unit, fractions. For Y3/4, this has centred on the core knowledge about fractions, that they are equal parts and that they are pieces of a whole. They have learnt to recognise the numerator and denominator, unit and non-unit fractions. Y5/6 have built on their previous fractions unit multiplying and dividing fractions and calculating fractions of an amount.

Science and art have both been highlights for the children. All the children have successfully built a series circuit using electrical components. They have been able to identify complete circuits and suggest ways to fix a broken circuit. In art, the children have constructed clay statues based on Ancient Sumer statues and figurines. Our school values were on show as patience, perseverance and determination were all needed to create a detailed figure that remained standing.

Thursday provided a day to reflect and build on the children's understanding of British Values, particularly mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs. The children engaged in a variety of activities including group discussions, scenarios and stories to deepen their understanding and consider how they can continue to demonstrate these values.
















Valentine's Day Menu

) Encourage journalling

Just like Riley, encourage your older children and young people to express their emotions and thoughts through journalling. It can be less confronting than speaking out loud and is a helpful way to process what is going on.

Make space for reflection

When children and young people reflect on their different emotions, it can help them better understand themselves and what they need.

Go for a walk, drive, or try some mindful colouring or baking together.

Be visual

Use imagery, such as emojis or flashcards to help children and young people recognise and label their feelings.

Practice mindfulness

Try mindful activities, and quiet family time, to enjoy being in the present moment. This can help children and young people be aware of their thoughts and emotions and learn a useful new coping technique.

Communicate

Feedback is crucial for helping us see our blind spots and gain greater insight. Children and young people are no different. Creating safe and supportive ways to share your own experience with your child can help them understand themselves and their impact on the world around them.
