#### Little Owls and Class 1

This week we have enjoyed talking about how, in the United Kingdom, the environment and weather change throughout the year. We shared our memories of activities we have done at different times of the year and enjoyed listening to the story 'One Year with Kipper' by Mick Inkpen. The children were introduced to the language relating to the passing of time as they talked, such as 'before', 'now', 'then' and 'later on'. The children shared what their favourite season is and why.

In maths, we have had great fun learning about mass and capacity. We enjoyed filling a container with different loose parts, such as pine cones, stones or corks before exploring whether the container could hold more of one object than another.

In English, we have continued to enjoy reading the story of Luna and her adventures, whilst learning the sounds Yy and Zz. We couldn't believe that there was a yak in Luna's kitchen! We are beginning to develop our knowledge of sentences and have enjoyed independently writing captions remembering capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

A big well done to you all for a great week of learning!

#### Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

We have had another busy week of learning in Class 2 this week. The children have thoroughly enjoyed having Miss Ross teach them for some of their lessons. They have listened well, been focussed and tried their hardest to show her how they are K.I.N.D. in all aspects of their learning. We had fun exploring a range of branches, looking at evergreen and deciduous trees, discussing the differences between leaf shape, how evergreen trees shed leaves continuously all year, deciduous trees are dormant during the winter months and then sketched a variety of branches. We have studied the repeating cycle of an apple tree, looking at how the tree changes during the seasons. In geography, we have delved deeper into the four countries of the United Kingdom, their capitals and some of their landmarks, looking at physical features and discussing what makes a hill a hill and a mountain a mountain! It is great to see how all the children are using their phonic learning, trying to build words when completing independent writing tasks and when reading - keep up the hard work and well done!

#### Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

The highlight for the children this week was the cross country, the opportunity to spend time outside and run freely. It was an afternoon of the children living out our school values of kindness, determination and doing their best. Every child did themselves proud, taking the challenge to run their distance, push themselves and they all experienced a sense of achievement. Mrs Cawthra saw the huge smiles as they crossed the finishing line. What was really great to see was the teamwork and encouragement as the children went to across to cheer their classmates on. This had an instant effect on the runners who smiled, appreciated the support and found a burst of energy. Well done KS2!

This has linked very well to our Christian Value for this half term, courage, and PSHE where the children are working on the unit 'Dreams and Goals'. We have discussed determination, keeping motivated to achieve goals and overcoming disappointment. Next week everyone is looking forward to finishing the last plot point of 'The Egyptian Cinderella' and creating their own version of the story.

The 2 day programme includes 5 sessions covering Understanding Autism, Behaviour, Communication, Sensory differences and Resilience, providing practical tools and strategies to support children and young people.
