

#### News from the Classes

#### Little Owls and Class 1

This week has been full of excitement and discovery in Class 1. We began the week with a magical moment, five of our butterflies had emerged from their chrysalis over the weekend! The children were fascinated as they observed them fluttering around, showing wonderful curiosity and care.

In phonics, we've been working hard and embracing the challenge of learning the sounds 'a' and 'e-e'. The children have shown great perseverance and concentration as they practised reading and writing these sounds. In maths, the focus has been on maps which sparked a lot of enthusiasm! We worked together to create large-scale maps and had great fun programming the Bee Bots to follow a route across them.

As part of our preparation for Reception's trip to the beach this afternoon, we have also been learning about the importance of looking after our environment and the impact of leaving litter on beaches. The children responded thoughtfully and showed a real sense of care for the world around them. We'll share more about our beach trip in our next newsletter - stay tuned!

We've also enjoyed welcoming and getting to know our new Little Owls this week. Our older children have done a fantastic job helping them settle in and showing them our daily routines. The balance bikes have been a particular favourite and have encouraged lots of teamwork and turn-taking.

Little Owls have been captivated by the story 'The Snail and the Whale', enjoying retelling the tale and exploring the themes of adventure and friendship.

#### Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

Last Friday we spent a wonderful day exploring habitats around Thorp Perrow Arboretum. Despite the incredibly hot temperatures, we wandered through the wooded areas spotting deciduous and evergreen trees, over the bog garden and onto the various tiny island areas, finding many examples of differing habitats. Later we enjoyed the display of owls flying overhead, learning about what their native habitats and diets would be. We even shared our lunchtime with some very inquisitive hens! The children were super spotters of varying habitats and the discussion back in the classroom about what each habitat would provide for a variety of animals (food, water, shelter and space) demonstrated their learning. Our history has moved on to researching some significant explorers from the past. We have found out about the accidental discovery of the Americas, the first expedition to the South Pole and the first man to step on the moon. Telling the time to o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past has been our maths focus and the children are now eagerly looking at the clock throughout the day to try to be the first to tell the correct time. A firm favourite from the week's learning has been art, printing in different hues using modelling clay. Well done everyone for another week of great learning. Enjoy the weekend and keep on practising telling the time!

#### Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

KS2 enjoyed a fantastic day at Tees Barrage on Monday. The children learnt about the physical features of the river from its sources as a spring at Cross Fell in the Pennines to the estuary at Teesmouth. Working in groups, the children then created a 3D model of the Tees river system out of sand including High Force waterfall, the meanders of the lower course and the estuary. Learning about the history of settlements, the children discussed where houses and factories would be built. The highlight of the day was going up into the control room, learning about the barrage and being allowed to open and close the lock gates. We were very impressed with the children's knowledge on the day and, returning to school, the children have created some fabulous information pages on the Tees demonstrating their learning.

On Tuesday, Y5 and Y6 had the marvellous opportunity to climb up Roseberry Topping. Here are some of their thoughts: Our instructor Georgie was so fun. The climb was challenging, the path was rocky and there were steep sections. However, we were determined, kept our spirits up with encouraging words to each other and reached the summit. Proud, happy and with a sense of achievement, we took in the view. It was amazing, it was such a lovely day. In the afternoon, we did many fun activities using our teamwork skills. From this day we learnt how to be determined, never give up and trust that we would make it to the top.
