Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

This week, Class 2 have been busy becoming little meteorologists! They have been recording the temperature in degrees Celsius each day using a thermometer and comparing their findings to weather forecasts. The children were excited to see how the temperature changed each day and noticed how the warm weather made a difference to their daily activities. They also discussed how different types of weather affect what we wear and the fun things we can do outside. For example, the children have been able to enjoy the warm spring weather and have been able to use the school field this week!

As part of their learning in the afternoon, Class 2 took an exciting journey to explore Kuala Lumpur. They discovered what makes the city unique and compared it to their knowledge of London. The children enjoyed looking at photos and maps, learning about famous landmarks and imagining what it would be like to experience the tropical heat of Malaysia. It has been a fantastic week of discovery and we are so proud of their curiosity and enthusiasm!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

After the fun of the theatre, KS2 have returned to another packed and busy week. In maths, Y3/4 have been adding and subtracting fractions whilst Y5/6 have completed work on decimals and begun work on ratio which relies on strong multiplication skills. We have started a new unit of writing based on a picture book, 'Float' by Daniel Miyares. We have focussed on different sentence structures starting with verbs or fronted adverbials as well as using alliteration and personification. In computing, Y3/4 have written procedures and sequences using Logo to create shapes and letters and were both amazed and delighted at creating spiral patterns. Y5/6 are in the process of writing a text adventure giving the reader interactive choices about the storyline. We look forward to sharing these in class next week.
