Little Owls and Class 1

What a fantastic week we've had in Class 1! Reception children have shown great bravery in their writing this week, inspired by 'Katie and the Sunflowers'. They have created some wonderful pieces using their imagination and growing confidence - well done writers! In Phonics, we have been working hard on blending and segmenting sounds, especially focusing on air and ure. The children are becoming super sound detectives and applying their phonics knowledge brilliantly in their reading and writing. Maths has been all about shapes - we've seen tremendous effort as children selected shapes for a purpose, rotated and manipulated them to create patterns and solve problems—what clever mathematicians we have.

In RE, we had a thoughtful and respectful discussion about where we belong and considered the different places where people from various religious worldviews might feel they belong. It was lovely to hear the children's ideas and reflections. Wednesday's sunshine gave us the perfect opportunity to take our athletics on the field. The children loved putting their running skills into practice, moving proficiently on the tracks as we prepare for Sports Day.

Little Owls have had great excitement in the quad as they have explored 'Butterfly Bouquet'. The children thoroughly enjoyed going on a wildlife hunt and learning all about butterflies - such a magical experience.

And finally... there's a special surprise delivery coming next week... we can't say too much just yet, but watch this space - something very exciting is on the way!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

We have enjoyed learning about some significant historical figures in both history and English over this half term, particularly during our writing unit on Malala Yousufzai. The children have been fascinated by her story, bravery and determination to fight for the rights for an education for all. Continuing the theme of brave and strong figures, we have written a biography on Rosa Parks, a woman who fought for the rights of black people in America, becoming famous for her refusal to give up her seat on a bus for a white person, which ultimately changed the law. It has been great to see the children's confidence grow, using a wider range of vocabulary and punctuation as they have written the story of a real person's life.

On Tuesday we were excited to welcome a visitor, Imran, into Class 2. We spent the afternoon exploring many beautiful artefacts and extending our knowledge of the faith of Islam. Imran taught us some of the Arabic alphabet, how some of our names would be pronounced and which names appear both in the Bible and the Qur'an. The children learnt more about the five words all Muslims must learn - Belief, Prayer, Charity, Fasting and Pilgrimage. They had superb questions ready to ask Imran and finished the afternoon by sampling a sweet and sticky date, one of the first foods many Muslims 'break their fast' with during the month of Ramadan. This visit has certainly helped the children have a deeper understanding of Islam and was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

KS2 Dive into the Water Cycle and World Rivers

This week, KS2 pupils have immersed themselves in the water cycle and world rivers. Their learning began with a deep dive into the water cycle, focusing on the key processes of evaporation, condensation, precipitation, and collection. Pupils created detailed diagrams, carried out simple experiments to observe condensation in action and began writing imaginative and informative tours from the perspective of a water droplet travelling through the cycle.

As the week continued, their attention turned to world rivers. The children explored some of the globe's most important waterways, including the Amazon, Nile, Yangtze and Mississippi. They researched and created engaging fact files and presentations packed with geographical facts—such as the length of each river, which continent it is on, the countries it flows through, and notable features along its course. Their enthusiasm and curiosity have been clear to see. It's been a week full of discovery, creativity and a deepening understanding of the natural world—and KS2 have certainly made a splash with their learning!

A special mention must go to our Year 6 pupils, who completed their SATs this week. They showed exceptional resilience, focus, and calm determination throughout the assessments, truly living out our school vision. We are incredibly proud of each and every one of them.

We'd also like to celebrate the rest of KS2, who showed great independence and flexibility while Year 6 were sitting their tests. They engaged in a range of learning activities with maturity and enthusiasm, adapting seamlessly to a different routine.

Well done to all KS2 for a fantastic week of learning and achievement!
