

#### News from the Classes

#### Little Owls and Class 1

We've had a truly wonderful final week of Summer Term 1 in Class 1! The children have worked so hard and shown such enthusiasm in everything they've done it's been a joy to see. A particularly special moment this week was the arrival of our class caterpillars. We are looking forward to observing their transformation from caterpillars to butterflies. This hands-on experience has sparked so many lovely discussions and questions about life cycles, and the children have shown great care and curiosity. In our outdoor area, our plants continue to flourish—the children have been brilliant at remembering to water them and take care of them. We've now spotted blooming flowers in our raised flower beds, a lovely reward for all their efforts!

Reception have continued to amaze us with their bug-themed writing this week. Using their phonics skills confidently, they've been independently spelling common exception words and writing sentences full of detail and imagination. Their progress has been incredible, and we're so proud of the confidence they are developing as writers. They've also really enjoyed working with tangrams to explore shape and pattern. It's been fantastic to see them manipulating the pieces to create animals, bugs, and their own imaginative designs. These activities have been great for problem-solving, spatial awareness, and collaborative learning. Our Little Owls have loved learning all about 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. They've retold the story with great enthusiasm and used it as inspiration for some beautiful transient art, carefully arranging natural and craft materials to create beautiful butterflies. Their creativity and attention to detail have been truly impressive!

As we wrap up this half term, we want to express how so proud of all that the children have achieved so far, and we're excited to see what our final half term in Class 1 will bring. Our next topic is 'On the Beach', and we can't wait to dive into seaside stories, sandy adventures, and lots more exciting learning!

#### Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

This half term has flown by and the children have certainly been very busy! Our history unit on 'Movers and Shakers', those people who have somehow shaped the world differently and made changes for others, has excited and interested the class. This week we have looked at a range of activists, scientists, explorers, monarchs and artists, discussing which person they felt was the most significant and why and who was least significant and why. Great class and paired discussions took place as children explained their choices and discussed the choices of others. We then took those people from history and ordered them chronologically by year of birth on a timeline - quite a challenge working with some larger numbers!

In science we have been thinking about the importance of bodily hygiene and how and why we should keep clean. Using the food diaries children completed at home, they have looked at which food groups they have eaten the right amounts of, which they should perhaps eat more of and which food groups should feature a little less in their diets. Thank you for your help at home with these.

In Forest School we were using scopes to explore nature around us and were amazed by the amount of birds and insects we spotted. May I please remind you of the importance of correct clothing for Forest School. Even though the weather is now much warmer, children are still spending time on their knees, lying on the floor and generally having potential messy fun. A pair of joggers, t-shirt or hoody with wellies or old trainers left in school will ensure uniforms and school shoes are not getting ruined, thank you.

Have a lovely half term, keep up with the reading, 1 Minute Maths and Numbots and see you in June!

#### News from the Classes cont.

#### Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

Another packed week comes to an end. The children have finished writing their tour guide of the water cycle, measured temperature of boiling, tepid and iced water in science and created atmospheric land-scape paintings carefully considering foreground and background components. In maths, Y5/6 have used their knowledge of co-ordinates in the four quadrants and worked on translating and reflecting shapes in different axes. Y3/4 have focussed on number skills with decimals and been practising times tables ready for the Y4 multiplication check after half term.

Our RE units at each school are different. At Carlton, this half term's big question has been "What is it like for someone to follow God?". We started by considering how easy or difficult it was for Noah to follow God. A detailed analysis of the story and thinking about it from Noah's perspective led to some interesting discussion. The children learnt that God made a covenant with Noah and sent a symbol, the rainbow, a sign of the covenant. We discussed covenants that are in our lives such as the rules of a game, Highway code and promises made when joining a group such as brownies, guides or scouts. This week, we identified the number of promises made with wedding vows and that for Christians, these are made before God. The children thought that these would be both easy to make and possibly difficult to keep.

At Bilsdale, we've been exploring the big question: "What do religions say to us about when life gets hard?" We began our journey by reading the touching story 'Heaven', which tells the story of a dog that dies. This led the children to reflect on their own thoughts and questions about life, loss, and what might happen after we die. Next, we explored beliefs about the soul. As part of this, the children took part in an activity where they drew their own portraits on one side of a page and wrote their personality traits on the other. This helped them think about the difference between what we look like and who we are inside leading to rich discussion about the soul or spirit and what makes us unique. The children then created artwork to represent the soul or spirit, using their imaginations to picture something that can't be seen. Through this creative expression, they explored ideas about whether we retain our characteristics beyond life, and how different religions try to answer what happens to the soul or spirit when we die.
