We would like to start by saying a big thank you for the additional plants you've kindly donated. Our garden is blooming with colour! The children have absolutely loved planting and caring for them, and it's sparked lots of lovely discussions about nature and growth.

It's been a wonderful four days of rich learning in EYFS. We had a lovely afternoon learning about Jesus and his special friends, exploring stories, and sharing thoughtful ideas together. We also enjoyed a creative flower themed art session inspired by famous artists, including the beautiful works of Claude Monet. Our little artists were truly inspired!

In maths, the children have been shining with their excellent counting skills and developing their number mastery through fun and engaging activities. Phonics has also been fantastic this week as we learned the sounds oi and eer, with lots of confident blending and segmenting happening across the class.

We also took time to mark VE Day, learning about its importance and significance. A special highlight was listening to Isaac share his facts about his memorable shell from India. Thank you, Isaac, for bringing history to life in such a personal and meaningful way.

What a super week it's been in Class 1. Thank you once again for your continued support.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

This week the children have been working hard on money. They have explored our coins and notes, learning their values and how to make different amounts of money. To further help them in this learning, it would be wonderful if you could spend some time exploring any coins and notes you may have in your purses or wallets. Can your child identify the coin or note, can they think of different ways to make a given amount, tell you how much two items would cost, what change they would get from £2.00, for example. Go on a shopping trip - can they buy an item with a 50p coin? Would they get any change?

In our geography, we have had fun exploring a map of Whitby, looking at symbols and keys to discover what they would find on a day trip. They navigated the map using compass directions and discussed what Whitby has to offer, if it would be a good holiday destination and why and if the symbols used were useful and clear to understand. Perhaps at home your child could draw a map of where they live, adding a key and symbols to help others navigate and explore the area. Don't forget to bring them to school if you do! Continuing our historical learning, the children discussed a range of significant historical figures from recent and distant past, deciding if they were activists, artists, scientists, explorers or monarchs. A shorter week, but packed with learning, well done!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

Our busy weeks always end with French and music on a Friday afternoon. Y5/6 are learning to say ten French words to describe activities they might do at the weekend in their topic "Le weekend" whilst Y3/4 are learning to introduce themselves and say their age in their topic "Presenting Me". In music, we have drawn upon our learning in geography with the children in groups composing and performing a piece representing the journey of a river. Selecting percussion instruments to represent the different sounds and movement of the water, they created their own graphic score to use to play their instrument. Ideas flowed and the children worked collaboratively performing their final piece to Mr Scott. Today's music lesson linked to VE Day focussing on wartime music. We noted how the beat, tunes and lyrics helped to lift morale and offered hope and peace.
