



News from the Classes

Carlton and Bilsdale EYFS

What a fantastic and busy week we have had in EYFS! The excitement is building as we continue to prepare for our school Nativity and our Class Christmas Sing-Along. The children have loved practising their songs, learning their star dance and taking on their special roles. Their enthusiasm is shining through and we cannot wait to share their hard work with you soon. In RE, the children continued exploring the question "Why do Christians perform Nativity plays at Christmas?" We began by recapping the Nativity story and discussing why this story is so important for Christians. The children learned that many Christians believe it tells the story of God coming to Earth as a baby. We also introduced a new word: 'incarnation', which Christians use to describe Jesus being both God and human at the same time. The children enjoyed practising this tricky new word together! After watching a short video of the Nativity, the class created "freeze-frame" scenes, acting out moments from the story and posing for photographs. These photos were later used to help build a timeline of the key events.

We have also been completing work on our topic Marvellous Machines. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring what machines are and how they help us. This week, we read No-Bot, the Robot with No Bottom! by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet. The story sparked lots of laughter and brilliant discussions! We talked about what robots are and the children shared what they already knew. We explained that robots are machines built by people to do specific tasks and that some robots even have human features. Little Owls had great fun designing and making their own creative robots, using a variety of materials to bring their imaginative ideas to life. On Wednesday, we revisited No-Bot and then explored programming using floor robots. This was a wonderful introduction to early coding skills and the children were highly engaged and eager to experiment!

Next week, as we step into Advent, we will begin our new topic: 'Sparkle and Shine'.

This exciting project teaches children about the celebrations that take place during the winter season and helps them explore the significance and symbolism of light at this special time of year. Thank you for your continued support. We look forward to another joyful week full of learning, celebration and festive sparkle!

News from the Classes

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

Class 2 have enjoyed another very productive week and have even managed to travel back in time!

Year 1 children have been focussing on place value beyond 20. They have used 100 squares, dominoes, cubes and counters to count on from 20 and back again to zero, trying to recognise numbers and identify the tens and the ones within those numbers - 65 is made of 6 tens and 5 ones. They are learning which number comes before and after a given number and count on in ones from any given number. Any support with counting on from 20 at home would be very much appreciated, giving children added confidence to progress with place value at school.

Year 2 children have shown our vision throughout the week as they have completed the first set of assessment booklets, so a very big well done to all of you for showing real perseverance and determination.

On Thursday, we travelled back in time to a Victorian classroom. The children loved dressing up in Victorian costumes and spent an afternoon in a 'Victorian' classroom, writing on slates, reciting times tables, learning about Queen Victoria and experiencing how very strict school was years ago. Here are some of the children's best (and worst) bits:

Tadhg - I liked dressing up and Mrs Leivers hitting the table with the cane. It made us all jump!

George - I loved writing the alphabet but I didn't like all the punishments!

Annie - I liked how the tables were in rows and the boys and girls sat separately.

William - I liked Mrs Leivers dressing up, but I didn't like it when she was so strict. Mrs Leivers acting was very scary!

Scarlett - I loved dressing up but didn't like the punishments.

Noah - When I accidentally snapped my chalk all the class got a punishment. I didn't like that because it wasn't fair.

Lavinia - I liked the dunce's hat and the cane on the table and dressing up as Victorians.

A fun afternoon was had by all!

Determination and creativity have been the two key skills on display this week. We've had quiet mornings full of focus, positivity and effort as children have demonstrated their learning in assessments.

Our afternoons have been creative with the children learning how pneumatic systems work, experimenting with syringes to compress air and cause movement. The children have then applied this knowledge to designing a moving mechanism box. The children greatly enjoyed making these - painting and decorating the boxes in different ways. They have reflected on their work, evaluating their products and suggesting further improvements. Well done everyone!



Illness


