

News from the Classes

Little Owls and Reception

We have had another wonderful week in EYFS, full of curiosity, creativity and joyful learning through play and exploration! The children have continued to thrive both indoors and outdoors, developing their independence, confidence and love of learning.

We began the week with a fantastic Forest School session for our Reception children. The children explored the changing autumn environment, noticing the colours of the leaves, collecting natural treasures to create a coaster. There was lots of teamwork, problem-solving and conversation about the signs of autumn—all wonderful opportunities for developing observation skills and language. Meanwhile, Little Owls enjoyed their own autumnal walk, looking closely at the world around them and spotting crunchy leaves underfoot. Their walk ended with an energetic and fun session on the timber trail, which gave them a great chance to practise balance, coordination and taking turns.

Reception have begun the exciting new story adventures of Nip and Nap on their ski trip! The children have been captivated by their snowy escapades and have been busy talking about cold places, skiing and winter clothing. In phonics, we have focused on the sounds k (ck) and e, and our common exception word of the week has been 'the'. The children have enjoyed practising these sounds in reading and writing activities. It is lovely to see their growing confidence in recognising and using them during play.

In our Mastering Number sessions, we have been practising subitising (recognising small quantities without counting) and comparing groups of three objects. The children have been matching sets 1:1 and identifying when groups have the same or a different number. It's wonderful to see them beginning to use mathematical language such as equal, more and fewer with growing understanding. Little Owls have been busy exploring patterns this week. They are beginning to spot patterns in the environment and create their own using colours, shapes and textures. It's been a joy to watch their creativity and focus develop through these hands-on experiences.

Our shared book focus has been the much-loved classic, Mr Gumpy's Outing. The children have really enjoyed retelling the story, acting out the characters and predicting what might happen next as more and more animals climb into the boat! The story also inspired some lovely discussions about where we live and places we have visited. I was so impressed by the children's memories and enthusiasm. We heard about trips to Jersey, Wales, Menorca, Majorca, London and Stokesley! These conversations helped the children make meaningful links between stories, real-life experiences and their sense of place.

With the beautiful autumn sunshine, we've made the most of our outdoor spaces. The children have enjoyed riding the balance bikes, building strength, coordination and confidence as they whizzed around the playground. They've also taken part in a range of active games that encourage teamwork, turn-taking and resilience.

We ended our week with a lovely circle time with Jigsaw Jenie and Jerry Cat, focusing on the theme of being responsible. The children shared thoughtful ideas about how we can look after our toys, each other and our environment. It was heartwarming to hear their understanding grow and to see them taking pride in being responsible members of our class community.

We hope you all have a wonderful, restful weekend and we look forward to another exciting week of learning ahead!

News from the Classes

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

Our week started creatively, with our Forest School afternoon. The children had great fun using varying grades of sandpaper to smooth rounds of wood, then used paint pens to carefully sketch a tree, showing all the parts - trunk, branches, leaves, blossom, fruits, roots. They thought about colours and shapes and also about how large the root system would need to be to hold the tree securely in the ground. The finished pieces all look lovely. A gentle reminder again of the importance of a complete change of clothing for Forest School. Even though we have had some sunny days, the field is often windy and cold and children spend a lot of time on their knees, bottoms and exploring. Wellies, waterproofs, hats and coats are an essential during the colder seasons to protect children from the rapidly changing elements. Thank you.

I have been delighted by the writing in English this week. 'A House that Once Was' has proved a great stimulus for some amazing use of adventurous vocabulary. All the children have pushed themselves to use new and unfamiliar words to describe both the setting and the house. Also, it is also super to see the Year 2s beginning to use some of the joins taught in their writing. Well done and keep it up! 'Where do new plants come from?' was our question in science this week and we have explored a variety of seeds and bulbs, looking at similarities and differences and looking at the structures of them that enable new plants to grow. Our spider plants are growing well but not yet producing any spiderettes - fingers crossed they soon will. We have investigated and sketched a variety of leaves and learnt the terms blade, margin, stalk and veins. Your support at home with reading is much appreciated and really does make a difference to your child's confidence and fluency. Please continue to listen to your child read their school book and enjoy and share bedtime stories. Thank you.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

This week Y3/4 children have started implementing their knowledge of place value in addition and subtraction. They have been using their new vocabulary of addend, sum, minuend, subtrahend and difference. They are learning that addition is commutative and further developing their mental strategies. Y5/6 are now on a multiplication and division unit. Working on multiples, common multiples and factors, the children have identified that knowledge of times facts is key. Extra practise using Times Table Rock Stars would sharpen skills and support learning.

With our packed, busy weeks the children love art and look forward to a more relaxed and mindful lesson. This half term, they have focussed on tints and tones using these to create landscapes that look realistic and full of depth. First, the children explored colour mixing by adding white to make tints (lighter colours) and black to make tones (darker colours). They experimented with different shades of blue, green, and brown to see how artists can use colour to show light, shadow, and distance in a picture. Once they had understood and explored tints and tones, the children began looking at landscapes by various artists exploring their use of colour and perspective. They learned that perspective helps an artist make flat paper look three-dimensional. By using a vanishing point—a special spot on the horizon where all lines appear to meet—they made roads, rivers, and fences that seem to stretch far into the distance.

KS2 Boys' Football

This week it was the boys turn to go to the football tournament. On Tuesday we went to Stokesley school and played three different schools.

We all really enjoyed it and we were all absolutely amazing. Despite trying really hard we came fourth but we all accepted that and stayed joyful because we scored 5 goals throughout the tournament. Everyone supported each other even if the other teams were scoring goals. We all played well and had fun. We had no injuries. We would like to thank Mrs Cawthra and Mr Body for taking us.

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over		
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode		
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.		
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics		
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared		
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started		
Scabies	they've had their first treatment		
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics		
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
