

News from the Classes

Little Owls and Reception

What a fantastic way to end our first half term in Reception and Little Owls! We are so proud of how much the children have achieved, grown in confidence and settled into school life.

Our final week began with a fun-filled afternoon of physical learning, where the children explored the early skills of rugby with Sarah from Guisborough Rugby Club. Everyone had a brilliant time being active, learning new movements and working together. Sarah was so impressed with the enthusiasm and great skills shown throughout the session - well done, everyone!

In Phonics, we have been focusing on the sounds Uu and Rr. The children have been practising identifying, saying and writing these letters and sounds. A special highlight this week has been seeing the children so excited to read their first reading books with words - a big milestone in their learning journey!

In Mastering Number, we've been introduced to the concept of wholes and parts. The children had great fun exploring this idea by identifying parts of different animal bodies and recognising that some whole objects have parts that can't be taken away. Their curiosity and understanding have been wonderful to see. Little Owls have also been busy showing off their brilliant 1:1 counting skills to 5. It has been lovely to watch them confidently demonstrate their understanding through play and practical activities.

As we come to the end of this first half term, we'd like to say a huge thank you to all our families for your continued support. The children have made an amazing start to their EYFS journey and we can't wait to see what the next half term brings!

News from the Classes

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

Week 8 and the end of the first half term as new Year 1s and new Year 2s. What a busy half term it has been, with lots of learning and lots of fun growing together. The children have shown every aspect of our K.I.N.D. vision and are all trying so hard to be their personal best in every lesson. Well done all of you, Class 2!

Why are plants important for animals, including humans?' was our big science question for this week. We have discussed how plants are used in many differing ways by animals for shelter, for food and for materials. Trees can be used by many birds for shelter, they provide homes for squirrels and can be used to create cabins and homes for humans. We discussed what plants we have enjoyed during the week in our school lunches and what our favourite plants are to eat. Continuing our learning on plant parts we have investigated leaves, comparing two leaves and learning the names of the different parts of a leaf - margin, blade, vein, stalk. Using leaves from the school grounds, children were able to identify what type of leaves they had collected - simple, palmate, compound or lobed. In history we have concluded our work looking at our school over time and are looking forward to finding out about what schools were like in the past. In R.E. the children have enjoyed finding out about some Jewish festivals and have shared challah bread, traditionally eaten on Friday nights by Jewish families to celebrate the Sabbath. Forest School was an afternoon of practical skills; using flints to create fire, using peelers to peel willow stems and collecting natural objects to create 'magical' potions. Great fun was had by all and resilience was certainly demonstrated when trying to light the cotton wool!

Our first week back after half term will be filled with some wonderful experiences to inspire our new learning units and I am sure will be thoroughly enjoyed by all of us. I hope you all enjoy a lovely holiday. Have a good rest, stay safe and keep up with that super reading.

Carlton & Bilsdale KS2

Our final science lessons for this unit have focussed on the mechanisms levers, pulleys and gears. We thought about how to lift heavy weights and open paint tins using levers and noted how the longer the lever arm from the fulcrum gave a mechanical advantage to lifting the load. Similarly, more pulleys meant the weight was distributed through more ropes, again leading to a mechanical advantage. This was certainly the case when we tried to lift water bottles from the floor using simple pulleys. Turning simple gears, the children learnt how the driver gear turns the follower in a different direction. They might ask at home to look at the chain gear on bikes or even explain how the pedals are the driver gears and the follower gears work in the same direction.

Next half term our science topic is Earth in Space. With the clocks changing this weekend, the nights will be darker earlier so this provides great opportunities for the children to look at the night sky. The children do have a chart to track the phases of the moon for the next month. If possible, please can you encourage them to sketch the shape of the moon over a period of days. We will discuss these in school over the next few weeks.

We have also ensured that the children have enough to read over the holiday. Some children have a second book as they are close to finishing their current book. Most children have set themselves a reading challenge and they also have a copy of Mr Scott's autumn reading challenge. A great time of year to snuggle up with a book. Something us teachers are going to do this holiday! Enjoy the half term break.

Selective Mutism Awareness Month?

Selective Mutism (SM) is an anxiety-based condition
where a person can speak comfortably in some situations
but finds it impossible to speak in others. It's not about
being shy or stubborn—anxiety is stopping them from
talking. This is the freeze part of the body's "fight, flight,
freeze" response.

Over time, a child with SM may develop the identity of "the person who doesn't talk," making it even harder to speak. Sadly, because SM is often misunderstood, children may be seen as rude or defiant when in fact they are experiencing intense anxiety.

With understanding and support from families, friends, and schools, children can overcome SM. Awareness and empathy make all the difference.
