### **News from the Classes**

# **Little Owls and Reception**

What a super third week of learning we have had in Little Owls and Reception! The children have been busy exploring, investigating and thinking deeply across all areas of learning.

In Mastering Number, we have been making our own collections of 2 and 3 objects and developing our understanding that 4 can be made with four 1s. The children showed great active learning as they sorted and checked their groups carefully. Our phonics learning has continued with the sounds Pp and Nn. We have enjoyed continuing the story of 'Nip and Nap' and spotting words that begin with our new sounds. The children are really enjoying their wordless books - these are a wonderful way to build storytelling and language skills. A gentle reminder to please share your child's book with them at home and make a note in their reading diary when you do. Books should come to school every day so we can celebrate progress together.

On Wednesday afternoon, we explored materials and their textures. The children learned that things can feel soft, hard, rough, smooth, sticky or dry. They were brilliant explorers as they used our feely boxes to guess the surprise objects inside. It was lovely to hear their descriptive language and imaginative suggestions! Meanwhile, Little Owls have thoroughly enjoyed the classic story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. They worked with Reception to create simple maps to show the family's journey - we even thought the bear might be hiding in the Quad at one point! This activity encouraged thinking critically as the children planned routes and discussed where to put different parts of the story.

It has been a week full of curiosity, problem-solving and joy. Well done everyone for such a fantastic start to the term, we are so proud of you all!

# Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

Week three finished already and the children's confidence continues to grow in their new Year 1 and Year 2 roles. We have continued some fabulous writing on Little Red Riding Hood, with some super use of adjectives and adverbs to improve initial ideas. The children have been thinking hard about word alternatives, using our 'Scale of Intent' to improve and deepen word choices (big - large - enormous - colossal) and all are trying their hardest to form letters correctly, with some great first attempts at joined writing in Year 2.

In science we have continued learning about plant parts and how they change as the seasons change too. Perhaps you could go plant spotting at the weekend and see if you can find some deciduous and evergreen trees. Take some photos or do a little sketch of what you find.

Year 2s are enjoying TTRS. Remember to focus on your 10-, 5- and 2-times tables to begin and challenge yourself to learn these facts in and out of order. Year 1s are enjoying Phonics Play, sorting real and fake words from Phase 2 and Phase 3. Please continue to support your child with reading at home and looking at the blending books and sound mats they have brought home.

I hope the lucky children who took a reading bag home have enjoyed reading and sharing. We are all excited to see what you have recorded in the sketch books and can't wait to swap bags for next week. Enjoy the weekend, have fun and see you on Monday for another week of working hard!

# Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

It's been a busy week in KS2. The children are coming to the end of their first writing unit a traditional tale, The Magic Paintbrush. With each part we write, we focus in on our intent as the authors about the mood we are trying to convey and how we can portray the personalities of the characters. Some great writing with the Emperor's anger being shown in the body language "with clenched fists" and "boiling red face" and precise verbs "he bellowed" and "fiercely demanded". We have also focussed on the correct punctuation for speech and look forward to seeing all these elements applied next week in the children's independent write.

"How do we know about the Shang dynasty?" was our key question in history. After listening to a podcast providing background information, the children then looked at images of artefacts found and had the opportunity to act as archaeologists using clues about what it looked like and what it was made from, to suggest its use and infer facts about the Chinese dynasty. The oracle bones were of particular intrigue. More about those next week!

# ParentPay scam warning


We have been made aware of a fraudulent app currently available on app stores that schools need to be aware of.
