



News from the Classes

Little Owls and Reception

We have had a fantastic week in EYFS, filled with exciting learning opportunities and plenty of creativity. In phonics, the children have continued the adventures of 'Nip and Nap' while learning to blend and segment the sounds Mm and Dd. It has been wonderful to hear about the enthusiasm for reading for pleasure at home, particularly with Sammy the owl joining in with story times. In maths, the children have been developing their subitising skills with arrangements of 2 and 3, as well as using positional language to describe patterns of 4. They are showing growing confidence and enjoyment in their mathematical thinking.

In RE, we reflected that many Christians give thanks to God at Harvest time. The children engaged thoughtfully in our discussion and enjoyed practising our Harvest song together. A real highlight of the week came on Wednesday afternoon, when we explored the theme of fantasy worlds. The children had a wonderful discussion about how magical imaginary places can be, before creating their own pictures of these worlds. We were especially inspired by Florence, who shared her vision of a world full of butterflies and rainbows. We have also been developing our physical skills in PE this week. The children had great fun completing the 'Friday Mile', showing wonderful determination and energy. Alongside this, we have been practising a range of circle games, which have helped us to build our coordination, teamwork and listening skills

Well done to all of the children for their curiosity, creativity and enthusiasm for learning this week.



















News from the Classes

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

Our history this week has taken us outdoors, looking at the front of our school building and comparing it to photographs from the past. We spotted lots of changes and had great discussions about what differences and similarities we had seen, why things may have changed and what we liked about the building in the past and what we like now. We put our sketching skills to the test again, sketching the school frontage and located which adults worked behind which windows.

In science we found many different plants around the school grounds and studied them closely. We drew a plant of our choice and will study the same plant over the next few weeks to see what changes we see as the season moves further into Autumn. After studying the roots and leaves of a spider plant, we planted some baby spider plants and are hoping they will grow and produce new baby plants themselves over time. We have learnt two new names - spiderettes and plantlets, the names for these plant babies.

In art the children have continued to enjoy studying the bright and colourful work of the American pop artist James Rizzi and have worked on creating a 3-D mural based on Rizzi's work, using papers and cardboard layering techniques.

And all this work is just in our afternoons! The mornings are crammed full of our English, phonics, maths and Mastering Numbers work too. Class 2 is very busy and the children are all trying their hardest to be independent learners and follow our K.I.N.D. values.

We loved looking at the work the children had done in the sketchbooks for each reading bag that had gone home last week and are already excited to see what the next children have enjoyed sharing with us on Monday. Keep up the great reading everyone, enjoy your weekend, have fun and stay safe.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

Our school vision of determination and doing our best has been evident this week with our independent write. Our children love writing and requested extra time to continue their work as they were so engaged in their own stories. We've really enjoyed reading them.

In Geography, the children have been exploring the local area using Ordnance Survey Maps. They have used their knowledge of grid references and contour lines to learn how both the physical and human features of the landscape around them are shown on a map.

RE is the only subject where we have different topics at each school. At Carlton, our key question is "How and why do believers show their commitments during the journey of life?" After discussing milestones in life, we have looked at different naming ceremonies for babies. For some Christians, baptism is a way of welcoming a baby into the church family. We recreated this service to help the children gain an understanding of the promises made and symbolism of different parts of the service. In the upcoming weeks, we will consider ceremonies that connect to dedicating life to a religion such as bar mitzvah and bat mitzvah for some Jewish children and the sacred thread ceremony for some Hindus.

Bilsdale KS2 have started learning about Hindu Dharma - one of the world's oldest religions, which began in India thousands of years ago. We discovered that it is very diverse, with many ways of living out Hindu beliefs. To help us understand this, we looked at a Banyan Tree. It grows from one trunk but spreads into many more, just like Hindu Dharma has no single founder but has grown and developed into many traditions and practices. We also learned key words like Mandir (temple), Dharma (a person's duty), Puja (worship), and Deity (a god or goddess). Did you know that around 1 million people in Britain are Hindu? Our local MP, Rishi Sunak, became the UK's first Hindu Prime Minister in 2022! This week we focused on Puja, an important daily practice for many Hindus. Just as we might start our mornings with routines like brushing teeth or eating breakfast, many Hindus begin their day with Puja. This is a way of connecting with Brahman (the supreme reality) by focusing on deities such as Ganesh (wisdom), Lakshmi (prosperity), and Shiva (transformation). Our learning is helping us understand how Hindu beliefs shape daily life, worship, and celebrations such as Diwali, both in India and here in the UK.

Upcoming writing in KS2

The next KS2 writing unit uses a video about an unknown creature being washed up on a beach and being helped by the local community. It has been affected by plastic pollution and ultimately dies. It is a great way to provoke brilliant writing, but we thought you might like to watch it in case your child comes home with any questions.

Safe around roads

One act of bad driving robbed the world of a beautiful, intelligent and caring young person. Our lives have been turned upside down by our daughter's death. **

Bereaved Dad whose daughter was killed in a car accident

It can be hard knowing how best to teach your child to stay safe. Here we help you to break it down and keep it simple.

Pedestrians – younger children

- · Get young children into the habit of holding your hand or use walking reins
- · Ask questions while you're out to help them understand simple ideas like 'fast' and 'slow'
- · You can start teaching the Green Cross Code from age five, encouraging children to stop, look, listen
- · But they won't always remember safety rules, especially if they're excited or spot a friend across the road
- · Children will copy what you do, so try to avoid stepping into the road without checking for traffic first. If you can do the right thing, it will help them get into good habits.



🖐 Pedestrians – older children

- · Children find it difficult judging the speed and distance of traffic until they're at least eight. Accidents peak around 12, as children start making independent journeys
- · Children learn by doing and practising. If they're moving to a new school, help them practise the route over the holidays. Where are the safe places to cross? What should they do if they see their bus and they're on the other side of the road?
- · They can be mesmerised by their mobiles, so remind them not to talk or text on their phones or listen to music while crossing the road.

· Make sure your car seat is the right one for your child's height and weight and for your car - not all seats fit all cars



UCycling

- · Get your child into the habit of wearing their helmet. If you cycle as a family, remember to wear
- · Look out for cycle training. Many schools offer courses to help children gain practical skills.

Priving – speed is everything when it comes to a child's chances of survival. They're 3.5 times more likely to die if hit by a car doing between 30-40 mph.

- · Keep an eye on your speed
- · Keep your phone in the glove compartment so it can't distract you.
