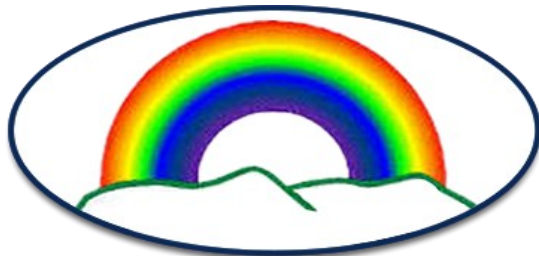

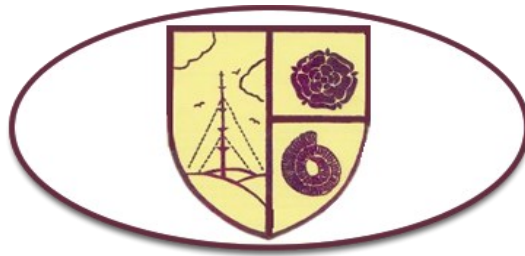

News from the Classes

Carlton and Bilsdale EYFS

It has been a wonderfully busy and exciting week of learning through play in EYFS!

We began the week with a brilliant Forest School afternoon for both Little Owls and Reception. Little Owls immersed themselves in a range of hands on woodland activities inspired by Little Red Riding Hood, building imagination, resilience and outdoor confidence. Reception children also had a fantastic time creating natural bird feeders using sticks, pinecones and seeds to support our local wildlife and develop their fine motor skills.

Miss Temprell has continued to lead Phonics and Maths sessions this week. Reception have been working exceptionally hard to consolidate all the sounds learned this term, showing growing independence and enthusiasm during their reading and writing activities. In Maths, the children have begun exploring the concept of doubling and have been practising subitising, instantly recognising quantities without counting, through games, manipulatives and number challenges. To reinforce this learning at home, we would like to remind families to make use of the White Rose Maths 'One Minute Maths' App. This free app has been carefully designed to help children build number confidence and fluency in short, engaging one minute bursts. It offers practice in key early maths skills including adding, subtracting, doubling and subitising, with each task providing a unique set of randomly generated questions that encourage children to learn concepts rather than memorise answers. The app is simple, child friendly and requires no login. Children can independently choose a topic, complete a one minute challenge and receive instant feedback on their progress.

On Wednesday afternoon, we concluded our Once Upon a Time topic with a special celebration fit for a King or Queen! Children enjoyed crafting crowns, engaging in royal role play and storytelling and revisiting their favourite traditional tales from the term. It was a magical and memorable end to our story based learning journey.

News from the Classes

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

We have reached the end of yet another half term and what a busy and challenging one it has been. We are all so very impressed with how the children have adapted to being taught by different teachers during Mrs Leivers' absence, and on her return today she was very pleased to see how well the children have coped, what they have produced in their books and how they have progressed. Well done everyone!

Forest School fun this week was the making of bird feeders. Children scooped out oranges, then filled them with lard and bird seed. A delight for our feathered friends in this very wet and cold weather.

We are progressing with addition and subtraction, using Base 10 and number line chunks to help with calculations. In English, the children have begun to write about 'The Day the Crayons Quit', using adverbs, similes and a growing range of adventurous vocabulary and synonym words.

I think it is safe to say that everyone's favourite lesson this week has been D.T., when the children all made a bookmark using binca. They learned how to thread a needle, how to tie a knot to begin, make a simple running stitch and then all had a go at tying off their running stitches to finish neatly. They added simple embellishments and had lots of fun. Perseverance and patience were evident throughout the afternoon and they were all proud of their finished articles.

Here are a few of the children's thoughts as we reach half term:

Dolly: I have really enjoyed learning how to sew.

Rocco: I have loved writing about the story 'The Day The Crayons Quit'.

George: I loved making our own woodland in Forest School.

Penelope: I really enjoyed doing our independent write on 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'.

Oscar: I have enjoyed all of our maths work.

Well done children, have a wonderful half term holiday and don't forget - keep reading!

Carlton & Bilsdale KS2

KS2 have experienced some of life's challenges this week with Y5/6 patiently and calmly waiting for delayed trains and Bilsdale admirably adapting to last minute changes. It was lovely to see their beaming smiles on Tuesday afternoon and all the children benefited from being together for our DT unit of Architecture. After looking at how the designs and materials of buildings have changed over time, we returned to Ancient Greece. We looked at the features of their buildings, particularly with the Doric, Ionic and Corinthian columns. The children then investigated how to strengthen structures. They first investigated the strength of triangles and squares using pieces of drinking straws and noted how using a triangle at each vertex of the square made it more stable. Our next experiment involved folding paper into cuboids and curving them into cylinders to create columns. Placing a book on top, the children were amazed to see the weight the paper could support. They are looking forward to using all this knowledge to create Greek temples.

With half term ahead, we have set the children the challenge of learning a poem off by heart to perform on Friday 27th February. This builds on the work we do every Friday and connects to our theme for World Book Day coming up in March.

After half term, our history topic of Ancient Greece continues and the children will be creating a piece of work about the Olympics. If they have the opportunity to watch any coverage of the Winter Olympics, this will greatly enrich their work. Please do take care if they try any sports over half term. We look forward to seeing the children back on Monday 23rd February.
