



## News from the Classes

### **Carlton and Bilsdale EYFS**

We have had a wonderful week in Class 1, with the children settling beautifully into their routines and embracing every learning opportunity with enthusiasm. One of the highlights was Forest School afternoon, where Little Owls spent time out on the field exploring activities inspired by the traditional tale The Gingerbread Man. The children delighted in using natural resources to retell parts of the story, following trails and imagining scenes from the tale unfolding around them. Their curiosity and imagination shone through as they worked together and shared ideas in the fresh winter air.

Throughout the week, Miss Temprell has continued to teach Phonics and Maths with great energy and creativity. We are incredibly proud to share that she received an exceptional lesson appraisal from the Lead Mentor from the University. This is a fantastic achievement and reflects not only her hard work but also the effort and engagement the children have shown during her sessions. A very big well done to everyone involved, your focus and determination have truly paid off.

Traditional tales have remained the theme at the heart of our work. This week, the children thoroughly enjoyed retelling the story of Cinderella, bringing the characters to life through expressive role play. Their confidence and sense of drama really shone as they stepped into the shoes of Cinderella, Fairy Godmother and the stepsisters!! Reception children took the story further by imagining their own alternative endings. Their ideas were wonderfully creative, some suggested Cinderella heading out for afternoon tea, while others imagined her setting off on a brave adventure on horseback. It was a joy to see the children thinking so independently and playfully about story structure.

In RE, our discussions continued around special stories and why they matter to different people. The children showed thoughtful engagement as they explored what the holy book for Muslims is and why it is treated with such respect. Their questions and reflections demonstrated a growing understanding of different beliefs and a gentle curiosity about the wider world.

Overall, it has been a super week of learning filled with imagination, teamwork, thoughtful discussion and plenty of smiles. Well done, Class 1, we are incredibly proud of you all and can't wait to see where your learning takes you next.

## News from the Classes

### Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

What a busy and exciting week we've had in Class 2!

We started the week with Forest School, where the children enjoyed spending time outdoors exploring natural materials. They created wonderful nature masks using leaves, sticks and natural resources, and experimented with leaf rubbing, carefully observing shapes, patterns, and textures. It was lovely to see such creativity and teamwork.

In Maths, we began our new topic on adding and subtracting within 100. The children have been practising using a range of strategies to help them solve calculations confidently, including practical resources and visual representations. They have shown great focus and enthusiasm when tackling new challenges.

In English, we introduced our new class text, *The Day the Crayons Quit*. The children have loved exploring the story, discussing the characters' opinions and emotions, and thinking carefully about different viewpoints. We also completed our independent write, where the children worked hard to apply their ideas, vocabulary, and sentence skills independently. We are very proud of the effort they put into their writing.

Well done, Class 2, for another fantastic week of learning! Thank you for your continued support.

### Carlton & Bilsdale KS2

We have had a productive week in KS2 with the continuation of myth writing and starting new units in maths: length and perimeter for Y3/4, decimals for Y5/6. Our science question this week was "Is it soluble?" with the children investigating which materials are soluble in water. Close observation and patience was required to allow substances to settle before deciding whether they had dissolved. History focussed on city states. After identifying the main features of a city state, we compared life in Athens to Sparta. Whilst Athens appealed to some children with its creative culture and democracy, some did not like the idea that women could only leave home with the permission of their husband. Although Sparta had a focus on producing strong fighters, some children did not like the idea of not seeing their fathers, who were warriors, or boys being treated harshly from the age of 7 having to cope with pain and survive with little food. Taking all these elements into consideration, the children reflected on where they would prefer to have lived and gave detailed reasons.
