



News from the Classes

Carlton and Bilsdale EYFS

We have had a truly positive and busy week of learning in EYFS. In class, the children have settled beautifully into their routines with Miss Temprell teaching mornings. She has embraced both our phonics and maths schemes of work and it was a pleasure to appraise a maths lesson focusing on capacity. The children worked incredibly hard and had great fun exploring and finding the capacity of different containers through practical, hands-on activities.

Little Owls joined Reception for Forest School afternoon on Monday and what a wonderful time they had! The children thoroughly enjoyed creating imaginative fires and playing in the mud kitchen, where lots of creativity, collaboration and laughter could be seen. So much fun was had by all. Music has also been a highlight this week. The children have loved learning to sing some old favourites, including Wind the Bobbin Up and are thoroughly enjoying having opportunities to play a range of musical instruments. In our One Upon a Time topic learning this week, we have stepped back into fairy tale land. The children had great fun thinking about which characters live where and worked hard to match a range of fairy tale homes to the correct characters. This proved to be quite a challenge, even the adults struggled at times!

Our ongoing love of The Three Little Pigs has continued, with the children enthusiastically re-enacting the story during their independent play in the Quad, demonstrating fantastic imagination and storytelling skills. Overall, it has been a great week of learning in EYFS. Well done to all the children for their hard work and enthusiasm.

News from the Classes

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

What a fantastic and busy time we have had in Key Stage 1! The children have shown great enthusiasm and effort across all areas of learning.

In maths, we have now finished our place value topic. The children have been confidently representing numbers, comparing amounts and explaining their thinking using mathematical vocabulary. It has been lovely to see them grow in confidence and independence as the unit progressed.

In English, we have been busy starting to plan our independent write based on 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'. The children explored the story, discussed characters and settings and worked hard to plan their own ideas. They are now feeling excited and ready to put their plans into writing.

Our DT lesson has been creative as the children have designed their own bag tags. They all showed great pride in their work!

In history, we continued our topic on 'Magnificent Monarchs'. The children have been learning about power and rule, as well as exploring royal residences, helping them to understand how monarchs lived in the past and how this compares to life today.

On Monday, we also enjoyed another session of forest school, where the children continued exploring making portals. This supported teamwork, imagination and outdoor learning skills.

We look forward to another exciting and busy week ahead!

Carlton & Bilsdale KS2

A new week saw the start of a new writing unit, Theseus and the Minotaur. The children have already applied elements of a myth with their opening line, setting and description of the minotaur. Even though we are only at the start of the story, it's been pleasing to see the children inspired to read other Greek myths.

It's well known that Mrs Grundmann likes a cup of coffee and Miss Jeffries loves a cup of tea. However, being busy teachers, our drinks are often cold! In science this week, the children investigated how to make the best thermal insulators by wrapping cups with different materials to try and keep their drinks warm. The children used thermometers and timers to measure the temperature every two minutes. Drawing conclusions from the results was more challenging as we looked for the lowest overall drop in temperatures, not the highest. KS2 discovered that wool was the best thermal insulator, so Miss Jeffries' mug may have to have a woolly jumper!

Bilsdale Blinds

As part of our continuing improvements to our school buildings, we had new blinds installed in Class 2 at Bilsdale this week. We're very pleased with how they have added a smart finish to the classroom.


