

News from the Classes

Carlton Class 1

Class 1 are helping the nocturnal animals - hedgehogs! On Thursday Class 1 headed up to the Wildlife Garden on a mission to help the hedgehogs. Although windy and chilly the children were full of enthusiasm and ready to learn. We discussed and gathered all the resources we would need (a huge thank you to all grown-ups for their donations of boxes.) We found the perfect place for a hedgehog to shelter in and secured a cosy spot using boxes, bricks and bedding. The children went on a mission for worms to put out as a light snack for the hedgehogs and even created a slope to help the hedgehogs get in and out! The children were full of initiative and ideas and thoroughly enjoyed their afternoon. To finish it off perfectly, we enjoyed a delicious treat of biscuits in the classroom. We've also been busy this week creating starry night pictures inspired by the patterns we saw in the 'Elmer' story book. These came out brilliantly!

Carlton and Bilsdale KS1

KS1 started their busy week of learning by showcasing their wonderful dance moves with Natalie...watch out Strictly! The children enjoyed creating a contemporary dance based on the theme .Winter/Christmas. based on 'Somewhere Only We Know' by Lily Allen (Classic John Lewis Christmas Advert 2013). In English, the children have produced some amazing writing this week, including sentences containing comparatives and superlatives based on our non-chronological report on cheetahs. They have worked incredibly hard with their vocabulary and punctuation and really got into their writing this week. In maths, we have moved onto subtraction, the children have really challenged themselves with their work. In Science, we have continued to explore, compare, group and sort a variety of common animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, invertebrates and mammals, based on observable features. As always, the children have shown their independence and determination across each of their curriculum subjects.

Bilsdale KS2 and Carlton Class 3 & 4

This week in History, KS2 have dived more deeply into how the discovery of how metal changed the way that people lived in the Bronze Age. They explored how tools and weapons were made from metals, such as bronze, which were more efficient than stone, so farming, trade and wealth increased. As a result, for the first time in Britain, there was a difference between the wealth and status of people because people with access to metal ores became rich. An increase in wealth led to conflicts between tribes and the need for defensive walls around settlements. They also looked at theories for the Bronze Age collapse, which included the weather, natural disasters and rebellion by the poor against the rich and decided for themselves which one they thought was the most plausible. Everyone is looking forward to starting to explore the Iron Age and the Celts next week.

Bilsdale Tile Workshop

The day began with the children looking at 3D maps of the locality and finding the River Seph and River Rye and hearing about the conservation work in the area to preserve the rivers' habitat. They were given some background information about the history of Rievaulx Abbey and how the rivers were used by the monks. They were told about the leather making at the abbey and how the leather was treated. This led to them being told about the restoration project of the troughs used for the leather and the competition to design a tile with the winning tiles to be used in the project. The children made a design for a tile and then make some clay tiles and a game on a leather board. It was a very interesting and informative morning with the children finding out a lot about the history and geography of their locality.
