Over the half-term it would be amazing if children in Class 1 could begin learning the names of the various dinosaurs and what makes them different from one another. Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

The children have had a great end to this half term - we are delighted with their enthusiasm for learning and continued hard work in all subjects. A big well done to KS1.

In English, we concluded our work on 'The Crow's Tale' by Naomi Howarth and produced our own stories based on the same characters but a different plot—the black crow decides to become a rainbow again.

This week, Year 2 enjoyed reading their group reading book 'The Castle' to our Year 1 pupils. A great book discussion followed and links were made to our history unit of work 'Magnificent Monarchs'.

In science, we enjoyed learning all about food chains and how they show that living things depend on one another for food. We were amazed to learn that plants always start a food chain because they are producers that make their own food using sunlight.

In PE, we continued to work hard at being champion gymnasts and creating short sequences including a range of rolls and balances.

Carlton and Bilsdale KS2

KS2 have been busy investigating volcanoes. They learnt that a volcano is a mountain or hill with an opening in the earth's crust that allows magma, gas and ash to reach the surface and is either active, dormant or extinct. There are four main types of volcanos: shield, stratovolcano, cinder cone and lava dome. The two types of volcanic eruption are effusive and explosive. When an explosive eruption occurs hot air, ash, and rocks rush downhill like an avalanche. This is called a pyroclastic flow and is extremely dangerous. Over the past few weeks, we have been keeping up to date with the volcanic activity in Iceland. The latest article about the lava damaging buildings in Grindavik, and how the evacuated people may not be able to return their town, was a powerful example of the destructive nature of volcanoes and led us into further research about the impact of volcanoes. The children took on the role of a volcanologist, producing reports on the consequences of volcanic activity on people and the land-scape. They found out that volcanic eruptions are an example of significant geographical activity and can destroy habitats, homes and businesses and can change the land.

This week was Children's Mental Health Week and this year's theme is My Voice Matters. KS2 have explored ways they can be heard and the importance of communicating their feelings and emotions.

On Tuesday, the children celebrated Internet Safety Day. KS2 watched an online lesson from the BBC about AI (artificial intelligence). All the children loved it.

Kitty: "I never realised that AI is already so prominent in our lives and that it is already the norm."

Alice: "AI is an amazing invention and is brilliant. In the lesson, we learned that not all robots use AI, and that AI physically can't take over the world."

Ernie and Charlie: "It was interesting to find out about facial recognition being AI and predicative text. Deep fakes and how things can be created that are not real felt a bit scary."

Next half term the children will start investigating earthquakes and use their knowledge about volcanoes and earthquakes to support their next writing units.
