

Little Owls and Class 1

What a wonderful second week back for Little Owls and Class 1! Reception were very lucky to go along to Strikes to learn all about plants, flowers and seeds. Strikes very kindly allowed us to plant our own plants to take home. The children were a credit to our school - they acted with kindness, respect and had lovely manners. The Little Owls took the chance to get some seeds planted in our outdoor planter. They sprinkled a variety of flowers, raked the compost and watered them to ensure they grow. Well done to our Little Owls and Reception children, you have made a great start to the Summer Term!

Carlton & Bilsdale KS1

This week started with a fun filled afternoon at Wisdom of the Woods. We had great fun learning about life in woodlands and enjoyed planting herbs with Mr Sims.

As part of our reading sessions this week, we have been working hard to complete a variety of reading comprehensions. Year 2 enjoyed reading a non fiction text all about Festivals and Year 1 enjoyed reading a narrative text based on a giraffe who could do yoga!

In maths, we have continued to enjoy our unit of work on measuring. This week we had great fun learning about capacity and volume.

In geography, the children enjoyed reading and sorting a selection of physical and human features picture cards into two groups: physical features and human features. We were delighted with how well the children were able to describe the features and characteristics of the coastline. A big well done to everyone.

Carlton and Bilsdale Y3/4

What a thrilling start to our week! Years 3/4 have been busy demonstrating our school vision and KIND whilst away at Newby Wiske Hall.

For many children this was one of the few or the very first experience of spending a night away from loved ones in a new environment. From the initial drop off and goodbyes, there were smiles and laughter all throughout our first residential experience. The children enjoyed and challenged themselves with a range of activities, with many surprising themselves with their determination and successes. Great teamwork during shelter building and fire lighting, many proud and beaming faces after the climbing wall had been scaled, amazing aims in archery, the thrill of the giant zipline and great competitive fun during micro-scooting games.

Our leader, Rowan, amused and entertained the children on Monday evening with a fun Balloon Splash activity, followed by hot chocolate before bedtime stories. Children were surprised by a gift of a badge and teddies, kindly provided by the PTFA. A later night than usual, but children were up and raring to go for day two.

The food was delicious, plentiful and quickly devoured after spending hours busy in the fresh air. The Hydration Stations were a huge hit!

It is safe to say that this has been an amazing learning opportunity for the children, a confidence builder and thoroughly enjoyed by all. It was lovely to see the children living out our KIND values and enjoying the opportunities to be independent learners. They are already talking about their next residential in Y5/6!

Carlton and Bilsdale Y5/6

Whilst Y3/4 were challenging themselves physically at Newby Wiske, Y5/6 continued their academic challenges particularly with reading, grammar and maths. Both year groups have been deepening their understanding of angles, measuring and drawing angles with a protractor and calculating missing angles using knowledge of vertically opposite angles and properties of triangles. Returning to school, all KS2 pupils have continued their science work. After writing a glossary to explain the properties of materials, the children have then tested a wide range of materials to identify whether they are hard, strong, flexible, magnetic, absorbent, waterproof or an conductor of electricity. There was some great teamwork on display as well as science skills or close observation and fair testing. The children have reflected on their results and considered uses of materials based on their properties.

Music Lessons

North Yorkshire Music Service offer peripatetic music lessons in school—more information below. If your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium funding and you'd like them to take part in music lessons please get in touch—school will share the cost of sessions from your child's premium funding.

We teach in 91% of secondary schools and 95% of primary schools in North Yorkshire

The North Yorkshire Music Service provides tuition in a wide variety of instruments:

Brass: cornet, trumpet, trombone, horn, euphonium, tuba; **Woodwind**: clarinet, flute, oboe, saxophone, bassoon; **Strings**: violin, viola, cello, double bass; **Guitars**: classical, acoustic, electric; **Percussion**: tuned percussion and kit; **Voice** and **Keyboard/piano**

Up to **32 lessons per year** are offered to pupils in small group or individual lessons. These take place mostly during the school day and are available to pupils attending schools throughout North Yorkshire. Lessons are sometimes available beyond the end of the school day or on Saturdays at music centres. **Rotating Timetables** allow for minimal disruption to the school day. **Regular contact** through **Practice Diaries** and **Termly Reports** ensure that parents are in contact with the Teacher and can support their child's practice at home.

Instruments are available to hire or can be bought using our assisted purchase scheme – see website for more details.

We also run six Saturday morning music centres across North Yorkshire.
